In the name of God, Amen!

Frances Routhier of the County of Bertie and State of N. C. Carolina being weak of body but of sound disposing mind and memory do make and retain this to be my last Will and Testament in the following manner to wit:

First my will and desire is that all my just debts be first paid and the residue of my property of my to be equally divided between my four children Joseph, John Bryan and Frank. Share and Share alike except my China, Glass, Plate, Pew, Silver Table Scions, Tea Spoons, Sugar-Spoon and Ladle which I give to my two daughters Frances and Jane.

Item It is my wish that should it be necessary to sell my land and negro that my children should be the purchasers as my Negro Woman Nancy has been a faithful servant I wish her and her children to remain in the family unless she should prefer to live with some other person, in that case I wish to have her choice.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my affectionate sons Joseph B. Routhier and John B. Routhier Executors to this my last Will and testament with full power to sell (if necessary) either to pay my debts or for a division amongst themselves any or the whole of my estate real and personal either at publick or private sale as they may think proper.

In the name of God, Amen!

I. Adeth Watson of the County of Martin and State of North Carolina being of perfect mind and memory (thanks be to God for the same) though weak of body and much reduced by sickness and affliction. And taking into consideration the uncertainty of human life and that it is ordained that all shall die and being desirous while living so to dispose of my estate both real and personal as shall best comport with my views among my children. Do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament passing and abrogating all other Wills, or parts of Wills by me heretofore made or declared in manner and form following (viz)

In giving I bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Potts & her husband John Potts, one negro girl named Curris, one Bed and furniture, one Oxen, three Cows and Calves, three Sow and broodly ~~Two~~ pigs, one Mare called the Jacky Mare half a dozen Clinton Chairs, one pair of Eighteen which said articles have heretofore been delivered to the said Nancy and John Potts, and I hereby rehonorate and discharge the said John Potts of all liability to me for all advances either in Cash, labor or goods made done or delivered to him heretofore by me except seven Head of cattle & three hens and Calves which I permitted him ^{my} for the last year, to take and their dues for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Watson all that tract of land which I purchased at a Sheriff's sale known by the name of the Cornell Place which will be more fully ^{described} by the Sheriff said to own, and so much of another tract purchased of Benjamin Slade as will be included within a line running in the Creek above Branch on the dividing line between John Thomas and Thomas Whalley running thence up the said Branch a direct line to a Cypress and Gum standing in a large pond thence a direct line easterly to the head of the first Branch to the southward of the said Branch said thence down the various courses of the said Branch to the said Benjamin Slade, ^{on} the edge of the Mill swamp thence up the said swamp the said Slade line to the dividing line of the said Thomas and Whalley, thence up this said line to the beginning in the Creek above Branch to have and to hold the same to him and his heirs for ever. Also I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas one negro man named Frank, one sorrel Mare Saddle and bridle, one Bed and furniture, two Sow and Pig, two hens & calves to him and his heirs for ever.

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Item I give and bequeath unto my son Arthur Watson all the residue of that tract of Land which I purchased of Benjamin F. Glade after deducting the tract above described which I took off & gave to my son Thomas Watson, including my dwelling House and a Manor Plantation etc, by in the said County and included within the limits of the land of the said Glade to me which will more fully appear thereby, to him and his heirs for ever. Also a Negro man named Bartley, one Bay Colt name Bradlock, one Bed & furniture two Cows and calves, two Sons & pigs to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Africa Watson two negro men Slings and Coffey one Bed and furniture, two Cows and calves, two Sons and pigs. Also it is my desire that my Executors purchase and furnish the said Slings and Coffey with one good Chest one Broad Ax and two narrow Axes and that the said Negro be hired annually as Tavern. And in case the said Negro shall be one month and dislodged my Executors are hereby commanded and authorized to sell the said Slings and Coffey and put the proceeds at Interest for the benefit of my Daughter Africa. Also I give and bequeath to my Daughter Africa Watson One Bay Mare called the Cornell Ward a Side Saddle and Bridle to have and to hold all the above described property given to the said Africa to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my two Daughters Nancy Purce and Africa Watson all my lots and lawn property in the town of Hamilton in the said County to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs for ever.

Item It is my Will and desire all the residue of my property of every description shall be sold and after paying all my just debts, be equally divided among my four above named Children Nancy Purce, Thomas Watson, Arthur Watson, and Africa Watson.

Item I here nominate constitute and appoint my well beloved Brother Jordan Watson and son in Law John Price of the said County to be Executor to this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this 7th day of Oct. A.D. 1825. (Signed) Arthur Watson was signed sealed declared and published before us by the Testator Arthur Watson to be his last Will and Testament the day and date first above written

That I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Ballard my negro fellow slave also all my household and kitchen furniture also one yoke of Steers also all my Stock of Hogs and cattle also my two Horses together with my Cart of iron to her forw also I leave unto my beloved wife Mary Ballard during her natural life three negroes namely Panama Washington and Hilton & after her death to return to my master Joseph Ballard to him and his heirs forever.

That I give and bequeath at the death of my wife Mary Ballard to Emma & Eliza & the equally divided between Mary Ann Ballard James Long's Children &之间 Eliza Ballard if my Brother Isham dies without Children then the legacy left to her shall be returned to my sister and brother Children, and I hereby make and ordain my brother Jacob Sherrard Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I the said Silas Ballard have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal this the day and year above written before witnesses published and declared by the said Silas Ballard the testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof.
