 Principally & First of all I Give & Recommend my Soul into the
 hands of Almighty God that Gave It and my body I
 Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Decent Christian
 Burial at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting
 But at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again
 by the Mighty Power of God & As touching such worldly Estate
 wherewith I have Pleas'd God to bless me in this life I Give
 Devise & Dispose of the same in the following Manner &
 Form First of all my will & Devise is that all my just
 Debts should be Paid First I Give the Land & Plantation wherupon
 Now I live to my Well beloved wife I Give to my Well beloved Wife
 one Bay Mare Bridle & Saddle & the Still the Hogs & Cattle
 to Raise the Children upon two feather Beds & Furniture & Two
 Petticoats & Lamb's Skins & Acquaintance to my well beloved wife
 one Walling Wheel & Lining Wheel all the spindles & Leather Wares
 two Hens two hoes & the Beer
 Now I Give to my well beloved son Robert King of Pine Woods Land &
 one Acre of Land & her Increase & the Hog Wares Tools and one year's
 schooling him & his heirs forever
 Now I Give and bequeath to my well beloved son William King the
 Plantation on which I live after my wife's Decease or Widow hood for him
 & for his heirs for ever
 Now I Give to my well beloved Daughter Mary King one feather Bed
 & Furniture I Give my Great hoes to be sold & the Money Divided
 Between my two Daughters Mary King & Elizabeth King & their
 heirs for ever Now I Give to my well beloved Daughter Elizabeth King
 one feather Bed & Furniture the & her heirs for ever
 Principally & Last of all I constitute & Appoint my Trusty
 friend William Daniel and my beloved wife Executors to this my

Last Will & Testament Wherby Resolving Disannulling & Revoking
 all & every other former will & Testament to me in any wise
 made or Allowed Ratifying & Confirming this and as other to be my last
 Will & Testament I Witness Hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 the Day and Year Above Written In presence Publick View and
 Declared by the said William King as his Last will & Testament

In the name of God Amen the twenty fifth Day of March 1785 I Benjamin
 Harrison being very sick and Weak in body and therefore it is appointed for
 all men once to Die thanks be to God for it Calling to mind the Mortality of
 my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die Do make &
 Ordain this my Last will & Testament that is to say Principally & first of
 all I Give & Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that Gave it
 and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like Manner
 at the Discretion of my Executors and as for my worldly Goods wherewith I
 have Pleas'd God to bless me I Give & Dispose of them in the following
 Manner I Give and bequeath to my sons John Harrison & William Harrison
 the Negro Woman called Phill and her Children Liberty Love and Estate
 I Also Give to my nephew Harrison one feather Bed & Furniture I Give
 one and a half Cows to my son William Harrison one feather Bed and
 furniture and one Cow and Calf Now I Give to my beloved Wife
 Elizabeth Harrison all the Part of my Estate both within Door & without
 for the Support of the Family and Raising of the Children for the term of
 eight years to be Equally Divided According to Law I Give to my
 beloved wife Elizabeth Harrison one third Part of the Mills and also one
 third Part of the Plantation thereunto belonging to her & to her heirs forever
 and all the Rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided between the Children
 I had by my Wife Elizabeth Harrison Gabriel Harrison Nancy Harrison
 Lett Harrison Samuel Harrison Martha Harrison Thomas Harrison

and Elizabeth Hardison and their Executors to Do as they think
 best with the Negroes that is Contending for Freedoms & so constitute
 and Appoint my beloved Brother, Wm Hardison and I Do hereby
 Appoint my friend John Stewart, and my Wife Elizabeth Hardison
 my sole and sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament to be
 Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal
 Signed Sealed Pronounced & Declared by me the said Benjamin
 Hardison as my last will & Testament

 Malachi Smith one Negroe boy by the name of buck to be his property
 After her Decease Delivered before us
 John Smith Jurat

North Carolina Martin County on the Ninth Day of June 1785
 we Saw Mary Smith take by the hand and Deliver two Negroes
 unto John Smith one by the name of Malachi and the other by the name
 of Vitch both lawfully delivered before us Charles Council
 John Council
 Daniel Bunker Jurat & Charles Council Jurat & furnished
 Delivered in the same manner

In the name of God Amen I James Gainer of the State of North
 Carolina County of Martin being Weak in body but of sound
 mind & memory Thanks be to god therefore willing to mind the Mortality
 of my Body & knowing it is Appointed for all our Once to die do make
 & Give in this my last Will & Testament the first & full Give &
 Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it &
 my body I recommend to the earth to be buried at the Discretion of my
 Executors & as touching such worldly Estate & with it both pleased
 God to bless me in this life I Give Devise & dispose of the same in the
 following manner & form

I Give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Gainer my Land &
 Plantation where I now live containing One Hundred Acres also my right
 & piece of Land whereon my father lived to her & her heirs for ever
 I Also Give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Gainer one Negroe Man
 named Wren during her Natural life & at her Decease to Elizabeth Noble
 Daughter of Sarah Noble to her & her heirs for ever

I Also Give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Gainer all the residue
 of my Estate both Real & Personal that is to say all my Stock Cattle Hogs
 & One house & all my Household Furniture & all my whole property both
 within Doors & without, unto the Value of one penny To her & her heirs
 for ever

Lest of all I constitute & Appoint my Trusty friend Thomas Statler Executor
 & my beloved Wife Mary Gainer Executrix to this my last Will & Testament
 Utterly Revoking & Disannulling every other former Will & Testament
 by me in anywise made In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & Seal this 13th of April 1786
