my last will & Testament in manner and form as follows:

in addition with the property he hath already received in
his purfession such as Labors Agroes &c &c To him and his
heirs for ever

Item I give unto my Loving daughter ~~Patsy~~ B Lewis five dollars
in addition with the property she hath already received
in her purfession such as Agroes &c &c to the and her heirs
for ever

Item I give unto my loving daughter Baker all such other
five dollars in addition with the property she hath already
received in her purfession such as Agroes &c &c

with a reserve that is shoued my said Daughter
Baker Nicholson before leaving no her lawfully begot
son of her body in that case one half of the agroes
property is to goest back to my two surviving daughters
Patsy B Lewis & Winifred Wiggins them & their heirs
share & thare a like

Item I give unto my son Samuel B Wiggins all the land
and plantation on the sound as I bought ofellaw
Lee agreeable to his deed Also seven Agroes, a stud
Horse & her Mares, Sins Toly and Little Bob also the
Two P. P. Horses, six brace Cattle six brace Sheep and five
Sows & pigs to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give unto my loving son John Wiggins all the
Land and plantation lying on the Norwest side the

Williams and Frank Wards heirs line for five hundred
acres more or less. Also the whole of Hickory

on the river & two large sweet gum near the swamp

Childs Mare Also Two Horses a bridle and a saddle six
brace cattle six Sows & pigs & five hundred Dollars for
the purpose of building a house to him and his heirs for
ever

Item I give unto my loving son Lawrence B Wiggins the
land & plantation wher on I now live for three hundred
and fifty acres more or less Also the old Crop swamp
plantation & land as is set out before given in legess
including the land on the river from John Wiggins corner
down to ware gutt & course of S. gate & swash to
lower end Hickory Neck for four hundred acres more
or less Also seven Agroes Abram Thrush old Tom
Perry Army Dinar & Jack also Five Horses a Saddle and
Bridle six brace Cattle & six Sows and pigs to him and
his heirs for ever

Item I give unto my two sons Abram Wiggins & Lawrence
Wiggins all my lands lying on the Burkes Creek swamp
including Birnett lands for four hundred acres more
or less to be equally divided share & share alike to
them and their heirs for ever

Item I give unto my son John Wiggins all that tract of land
Bairning John Garret the upper end long position for
one hundred and fifty acres more or less to him and
his heirs for ever

Item. I give unto my loving wife Salter Wiggins Five Negroes
Nanney buck & Child Mulrine & 1/2 acre to her at
her disposal also I leave unto my loving wife of all the
remainder of Negroes as is not before given in legacies during
her natural life for the support of raising and educating
my three youngest Children Winifred Mason & Lawrence
B. Wiggins also the remainder part of my Estate as is not
before given away in legacies - consisting of House hold
and kitchen furniture plantation, contents and
live stock of all kinds. I leave to the use of my loving
during her natural life and after her death I my self
act on par & my two young sons, Cleason & Lawrence
Sufficiently educated the remainder then with the rest
- as is not given a way to be equally divided between
my eight children, Baker Wiggins, Peter B Lewis, John
Wiggins, Samuel D. Wiggins, Cleonel Nicholson, Winifred
Wiggins, Cleason D. Wiggins, & Lawrence B. Wiggins, them
of those alike them & their heirs forever

Item further to my will I desire that my Es^{co} hereafter men
named shall help my two youngest sons, Cleason &
& Lawrence, & negro, with sum of my wife's negroes
on their land in Tortoise County under the care of a
good overseer until they think advisable for the pur-
pose of raising supply for their Education & maintenance
and do further put my trust & confidence in my Es^{co}
to treat their slaves to the best advantage to settle my Es^{co}
slaves, I demands I see to bringing up my two sons to the
best advantage and further them while and during that
my son John Wiggins share an equal share in fishing were
settled with my other two young sons, Cleason & Lawrence
by furnishing equal number of hands than
& their portability -

Firstly, I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my loving
wife Salter Wiggins my two sons, Samuel D. Wiggins, John
Wiggins & my friend James A. Baker my sole Ex^{co}
to this my last will and Testament looking & attending
all other wills here to before made by me and do ratify
constitute and ordain this to be my last will & Testament
Signed & sealed the 26th day of March A.D. 1808

disposed of at the present time being sum what Doubtless
for Land property and collect and make use of same
what of the money is my wish and desire that all the remainder
of his property after his debts are paid shall be Equally
divided with the principal sum as my loving son in law
Green Lewis and to him no interest to be had between
my eight loving Children Baker Wiggins Peter B Lewis
Samuel D. Wiggins John Wiggins, Cleonel Nicholson
Winifred Wiggins Cleason D. Wiggins & Lawrence B.
Wiggins them & their heirs there and those alike
