and feather duster also her my house old furniture what ever my house and plantation
which I leave her my stock of wear apparel etc Item I give my wife beloved daughter one
hundred dollars to back all the expense of my burial after paying my debts I leave to be divided
equally among my sons and daughters male and female my another friend Abram Williams
and others here bearing of his name and wife and testament in witness thereof I the said Jacob Davis
do by this my last will and testament set my home and lot the acre and a half above written

and for her to let her children have of her said plantation to these three he has in debt
Item I give to my wife beloved son Jonathan Davis my brick plantation when he arrives to the age of
Twenty and after his mother both all the land that I have or will appear by reason due to her
and no more for ever Item I give to my wife and son that very soon Jonathan to set Abram Davis
after Davis wife James and Elizabeth to have every hundred I have valued after their mother death
and to have as much as will amount to his hundred dollars a lease on the same their brother
and son Tom that is my wife and son to Jonathan Davis have my other son Tom at his
valuation a sum of a hundred and seven the rest of my property of my two sons I leave a between all
my four children at their mother both a part of a hundred and fifteen dollars and fifteen cents my son Jonathan Davis
to my wife beloved wife penitely Davis Executors to this my last will and Testament in witness

Testament in manner following that is to say first I leave unto my beloved wife Mary
Davis during her natural life a sum of £100 per Annum to be paid to her yearly by
my plantation wherein I leave her and all the land thereunto belonging also my farmings
tools consisting of ploughs and wagons horse etc also three cows & calves two horses known
by the name of Jethro & Jack Lemire all my hogs, hounds & hawks however except
such as are left I give to my son Michael King & my black walnut table to my son
John King Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny Higgins and her heirs one
acre of ground lying after the death of her said mother a sum I leave to my son Davis
by me named Lemire after the death of his father of £100 per Annum to be paid to my son Davis
as his last will and bequeath of his body then to come to my son Charles Michael King & William
King of them £60 also I leave unto my son David King during his natural life two negroes
one of which and of £20 David King should use leaving me his last will and bequeath of
his body then the negroes to come to my son Charles Michael King &

Item I give of them have one acre to my son Davis
where to rent live and eat the land thereunto belonging after his death £6 also are to my son
William King one negro man named Green to him of his heirs £6 also are to my son
named Green the sixth of his said mother of my daughter Elizabeth Williams
Item I give of bequeath to my son Charles King of his heirs £6 one negro man named
King & my brother Tools - Item I give to my son Michael King his heirs £6
one negro man named Peter - Item I give of bequeath to my Grand son Michael King
Tools five shillings sterling money Item I give to my daughter Mary Williams
five shillings sterling money Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Parker his
Tools five shillings sterling money Item It is my will & desire that my plantation wherein
I now live after the death of my said wife be sold and the money equally among
between my four sons of their heirs £6 that is to say Michael King John King
& William King after taking out of the said money owing from the sale of the
land £6 hundred dollars for my son John King on his heirs £6 also it is my
will my negro woman Maria & her two children Matthew & Sarah and all their
future increase to sold and the money arising from the sale of said Negroes be
equally divided between my four children of their heirs £6 Michael King John
King William C. King and Fanny Higgins after the death of their mother
Mary King And I hereby make and declare my two sons John King William
King executors of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I the 1st D
Michael King have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the
day & year above written

& money to him of his heirs for ever. I nominate and appoint
my Husband Holton G. Hall Executor of this my last Will
and Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
affixed my seal this seventeenth day of January in the Year
Eight hundred and Ten
