 Then I gave & conveyed to my son Charles King & his heirs & to one negro man named
 Hampton & my negroes tools. Then I gave to my son William King his heirs &
 one negro man named Peter. Then I gave & conveyed to my grand son Michael John
 three five shillings trading money. Then I gave to my daughter Mary Williams
 five shillings trading money. Then I gave to my daughter Elizabeth Parker five
 shillings trading money. Then it is my will & desire that my plantation whereon
 I now live after the death of my said wife be sold and the money equally divided
 between my three sons & their heirs & to say Michael King John King
 & William Henry after taking out of the said money owing from the sale of the
 land six hundred dollars for my son John to King or his heirs & also it is my
 will that my negro woman Marian & her two children Matthew & David and all their
 future increase be sold and the money arising from the sale of said negroes be
