In the name of God I William P. Brown do hereby in some order and memory thanks be to God for the same but knowing the contents of death has being a wife health to record this my last will and Testament in manner here given as follows -
 1st I give unto my son George Brown the Land and plantation I purchased of William P. Brown and which I owned containing about hundred acres more or less which I have a Red for a title which I will make some or and which the title is to be given to my son George Brown I further give to George Brown the following negroes, named, Mabel & Stephen -
 2nd I give unto my son W. R. Brown all the Land and plantation purchased of John P. Brown and which I owned containing about hundred and twenty acres more or less - I further give him W. R. Brown the Land which I purchased containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less, I intend he will be well as to the Land that was given to me and my children by Anne Brown, also in the same Land to George Brown and Anne Brown, I further give unto my son W. R. Brown the following negroes, named, Isaac, Thomas and John -
 3rd I leave unto my daughter Sidney Brown the following negroes, named, William, Hannah, Stephen, and Ben, during her natural life and after children I have, if none I give them to George W. R. Brown & Anne Brown or their heirs I further give to my daughter Sidney Brown one hundred and fifty Dollars to buy or good note, one Red and furnished her chest and one Chest -
 4th I leave to my daughter Ameliza Brown the following negroes, named, George, Mary, Mabel, Rebecca, John Elias during her natural life and to her children if any of them I further give to George W. R. Brown & Anne Brown and their heirs - I further give to my daughter Ameliza Brown two hundred and fifty Dollars to buy or good note one Red and furnished her chest and one Chest -
 5th I leave unto my daughter W. D. Spence the following negroes, named, Joseph, Charlotte, White as I intend they being the negroes I leave to my daughter Maria Spence which the said William I give to her and which she has a leaf - I further give to her body or heirs at the age of twenty and years, but if said William I Spence shall die without a lawful heir begotten of his body or heirs at the age of twenty and years the above named property or negroes with their increase to return back to my children George W. R. Brown, Sidney & Ameliza Brown or their representatives -
 The balance of my property that I have not given away or less after my just debt are paid to be equally divided between my surviving children George W. R. Brown, Sidney & Ameliza Brown -
