Then was the within paper reading purporting to be the last will and testament of John DeWolf exhibited in open Court and the due mention thereof made according to law by the oath of Geo. Pigg one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and in witness whereof the Court did that the same be recorded at the same time exhibited Hester and Wm. P. Brown the executors named in said will appeared in Court and requested that right to qualify as executors thereof and Thomas M. Slaughter that Geo. Pigg ^{be appointed} Administrator with the will annexed of the said John DeWolf upon entering into bond in the sum of \$1000 with Joseph DeWitt and Archibald Hester his sureties bond given and being qualified according to law

I Deborah Simpson of the County of Walter and State of South Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

1st That my executor (whomsoever named) shall provide for my body & decent burial, funeral or burials of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and whomsoever owing out of the first money that may come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate

2nd I give and devise to my son William Simpson Fifty Acres of land to be laid off out of the tract of land which I now own and on which I now reside to be laid off on the part of said tract of land from that part which adjoins the lands of Clayton Moore W. P. Warrens heirs
3rd I give and devise to my three daughters (Ansona Luccinda Nancy the balance of the tract of land whereon I now reside to be equally divided among them after deducting the Fifty Acres devised to my son William as aforesaid

1st I give and devise to my daughter Ansona Luccinda each one fourth part of my estate and it is my wish and desire that the balance of my property (chattel property stock &c) should be sold by my executors and after paying all just debts and all other expenses the balance to be equally divided between my three daughters Ansona Luccinda & Nancy
(And lastly) I hereby do constitute and appoint my friend George W. Ward my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute the my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby reciting and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me in respect whereof I remaine still unbound and free the 24th day of January A. D. 1853
