I Frederick Taylor of the County of Martin and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner following That is to say

First that my executors (herein after named) shall provide for my body a decent burial to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whom soever owing out of the monies that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item I bind to my beloved daughter Anderilla Settles wife certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in Martin County and State of North Carolina Situated on an Spurrs branch

abutting the land of Miss Harrell and Mr. L. Brown, being beginning on the branch where the road crosses the branch running north 20 west 4 poles thence along the branch along the south 20 west 65 poles thence north 22 east to Harrells line thence south 60 east to the run of Spurrs branch thence down the several courses of said branch to the first station containing by estimation fifty acres more or less and give it to her children if any If no children I wish it to return to my lawful heirs.

Item I bind to my beloved daughter Anna Eliza Harrell a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in Martin County and State of North Carolina Situated as follows Beginning where the road crosses Spurrs branch abutting the heirs of R. W. Shured running north 22 west 4 pole thence north 23 $\frac{1}{2}$  west 65 poles thence south 24 $\frac{1}{2}$  west to Mr. R. W. Shured line thence along Mr. R. W. Shureds line 39 poles thence corner thence a shale course to the beginning and I give it to her children of any if no child to return to my heirs.
