 a line of marked Trees Beginning on the mark at a Pine
 Between the place where he now lives and the plantation
 whereon I now live also one Feather Bed & Furniture
 I say to my son John Bryan to him and his heirs forever
 Item I also lend the use of all and every Individual of the
 Rest of my whole Estate to my well beloved wife Ann
 Bryan During her life or widow and after her death to
 be Equally divided amongst all of my Children that
 remains a live at her death Elias Bryan Excepted I
 also appoint my two sons Needham Bryan and Elias
 Bryan Executors to this my last will and Testament
 Given under my hand this sixteenth Day of December
 in the year 1773

 which I Reserve to be sold likewise I Give and Bequeath
 unto Elizabeth my eldest Daughter five shillings likewise
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary five shillings
 likewise I Give and Bequeath unto Charity my Daughter
 five shillings likewise I Give and Bequeath to the Child
 my wife is now in Travel with if a Daughter five shillings
 if a son my Plantation near the mouth of the Little River
 in the province and County of aforesaid & that he shall have
 possession of it at the age of seventeen likewise all my
 House hold articles I Give to my wife during her life
 and after the decease of my wife the Plantation whereon I now
 live together with the Rest of my Estate shall be Equally divided
 among my Children likewise I constitute and appoint
 Rebecca my wife and James Brown of Abner Brown
 Executors of this my last will and Testament Revoking
 all former wills and Testaments made by me before this
 signed with my seal and dated the first day of December
 one thousand seven Hundred and seventy two
