Item 9 I leave unto my wife Nancy Eason one half of a Negro Boy by the name of Rose and at her death I give the same negro boy Rose unto my son Abner Eason. Item 10th I leave unto my wife Nancy Eason one half of a Negro Girl by the name of Matilda and at her death I give the same negro girl Matilda unto my son Abner Eason. Item 11 I leave unto my wife Nancy Eason one negro girl by the name of Eliza and at her death I give the same negro girl Eliza unto my two sons Amos and Rubin of Robeson and Horry Co. of South Carolina. Item 12th I leave unto my wife Nancy Eason one Negro Boy by the name Charly and at her death I give unto my wife Nancy Eason one negro girl by the name of Wesley and his income and one hundred dollars in money. Item 14th I give unto my son Abner Eason one half of all my slaves including one half of my house hold and kitchen furniture and one half of all my stock of hogs hens and cattle and one half of all my stock of rice and one half of all the Slaves that I have in hand and one half of all my farm and one half of my farming utensils. Item 15th I give unto my son Abner Eason one half of a Negro Boy by the name of Rose and one half of a Negro girl by the name of Matilda and all her income and one house and furniture. Item 16th I give unto my son Abner Eason one negro Boy by the name of Eliza and Item 17th I give unto my son Abner Eason one Negro Boy by the name of Charly. Item 18th I give unto my son Abner Eason one Negro girl by the name of Elizabeth. I hereby appoint Abner Eason my Executor of this my last will and testament in Robeson County I then caused to set my name and Seal this 7th day of May 1854.

In the name of God amen 2 Henry Griffins heirs of the State of North Carolina and County of Martin being of sound mind and perfect mind and memory being to this the last day of January in thousand eight hundred and fifty seven year of our Lord Jesus Christ do this the last day of January in thousand eight hundred and fifty seven year of our Lord Jesus Christ publish this my last will and testament.

1st I give to my son John D. Griffis my Land and plantation whereto I now live with all appurtenances therunto belonging also I give to the s^d John D. one hundred acres of Land adjoining Ada Hollings and wife J. Hollings also I give to John D. the Black mare and her increase also two Sheep and Saddle also one cart and gear also I give to John all of my young Stock and in good shape also one house well and hand stonewall I give to my son John D. all of my Stock of cattle with the exception of one cow & calf also I give to John all three Sons and thirty Girls also I give to John D. all of my Stock of Pigs Bacon Lard and pudder also one Blue coat Suit also two feather Beds and furniture also all my Kitchen furniture I give to the s^d John D. and Nancy Griffis also I give to John D. his Shirt Cams and all my Corps clothes also I give to John D. his Irons, knaps &c I give to my son Henry W. Griffis twenty acres of land lying on the property I Deemed joining John Collier and others 3. I give to my daughter Nancy Griffis one feather Bed and furniture also one Dresser and Glass also one cow and Calf also one Linen Wardrobe and one Kitchen wheel to my daughter Nancy Griffis 4th I give to my daughter Hamette Hayes one feather Bed that she has run in her possession 5. I give to my daughter Clara one two year old Lamb and one feather Bed that she has run in her possession 6. I give to my daughter Sarah Holling one feather Bed. I want my Aug mon to be settled by my Executors for the purpose of paying my just debts and if any remainder left after so doing I want the same to be equally divided between my four daughters to viz Nancy, Clara, Sally & Elizabeth also I want my daughter Elizabeth Rilly to have out of my Estate for nothing in Cash I want all of my sheep not mentioned above to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my four daughters to viz Nancy, Clara, Sally and Elizabeth I hereby make and ordain my son John D. Griffis & his wife Sissie B. with his wife and all in his right and title of him as I have made & done my bond and by date above Abner D. Eason
