one Chest one Table and two Chairs and one Box & Calf and
Linen White
4. I give to my Son Daniel Peal my kitchen Island table of plain
wth the exception of the paying my son Joel Peal one hundred and
Fifty Dollars if he goes return to this Country to demand the

furniture and one Box and Calf

and furniture and one Chest
6. I give to my son Henry Peal all my Red Boston and
Lard and Oil, feather Red Boston and furniture and one
Pewter Plate
7. I give to my son John R. Peal all my Lard which
I now have and red feather Red Boston and furniture and one
Calf and Calf
8. I give to my three Daughters Elizabeth Chesterfield
and both the three said children my negro Calf Peal slave
if she goes then and they live or the three just that does live
if she does not have them three else give her to my third
Daughter about mentioned that they be divided when Celin comes
of age but if Red have the three children above mentioned
to my wish and desire that she and the balance of his inheritance
highly divided between all my children namely Elizabeth
and Daniel Chesterfield Henry and John R. Peal —
9. I give my wish that all my unmention'd property be sold
and my debt paid and if any thing left it be equally divided
between all my children above named day and date above —
I give sealed and delivered in County of Meck
I make and ordain Humphrey Fletchers Executor to this my
last Will & Testament
