of North Carolina. And of Martin County being very sick and weak in body  
but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to god therefore calling unto  
mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that he is appointed for all men  
Once to die do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament that  
is to say principally & first of all I give and recommend my soul into  
the hands of God that gave it and my body I command to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors  
Nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the  
same by the Mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estates which  
will be hath pleased God to bestow in this life I give and make disposure of the  
same in the following Manner and form  
imprimis Give unto my little Mary Williams otherwise against  
John Powell & Nathan Mayo for one hundred £ in Specie & Mill Dollars  
Year I give unto my other daughter Barbara five Millions Sterling  
Year I give unto Allen Webster A Note of hand in the sum of £

and 50 thousand Dollars to be paid him by Spanish Mill & Warre  
Year I give unto Charlotte Connall and Rachel Connall & Ruth of her  
against Peter Howell & Nathan Mayo for one hundred & twenty five £ and  
One thousand Spanish Mill Dollars to be Equally divided between Charlotte Connall  
& Rachel Connall Also twelve pounds Pounds ten Shillings & two pence  
Year I give also Connall my Mass Bridget, Saddle & Gun I give unto  
Rachel Connall A Note of hand against Thomas Price for five £ of her  
my half and one third of her Saddle & Right Connall my pair of black buckles  
and one pair of horse buckles and my weasing Glass & Paste  
Year my desire is that all the remainder of my Estate be sold to paying debts  
I also appoint Nathan Mayo & Rachel Connall my Executrix of this my last  
Will and Testament In Testimony whereof these Presents with my hand & seal  
the Day & year first mentioned signed sealed published pronounced and  
declared by the Dr John Davis as his last Will & Testament in the presence  
of the Subscribers witnesses

you and beseeche as followeth to witness I give legateath to my wife  
beloved wife Elizabeth all and singular my land & Government goods  
& Chattels to her use & property to be and remain her own and at her  
disposal to do with as she pleases whom I appoint to be in my  
lawfull execution of this my last Will & Testament to be witness whereof  
I have caused to be my hand & seal this 15<sup>th</sup> of Sept: 1795
