Leggett and the other half to my Wife during her life and then
to be Equally Among all my Children

As to my Will and devise that my Negro Man Jack serve at my Wife's
decease be Equally Divided Among my four Children Sallies
Leggett Annas Leggett Wines Leggett & Anne Leggett Personally
My last of all I constitute and Appoint my Justices of the Peace
Thomas Hunter & my two Sons James Leggett and Daniel Leggett my
sole Executors to this my Last Will & Testament, attested by two being
disannulling & disallowing every other former Will and Testament
made by me in any kind made ratifying & confirming this & the other to be my
