In the name of God Almecht. I Jonathan Hart Eason of the County of Martin in the State of North Carolina calling to mind the uncertainty of my life and the certainty of death do despatch my last will and testament as follows that is to say

1st as to my mortal body, after death. I desire it to be committed to the earth from whence it came in such manner as my executors may think proper. My soul I command to the tender mercies of that great and benevolent Being who gave it to me and at length such worthy substance as I am or may be before such as my death I despatch of the same as follows viz. First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Eason all my estate & property chosen in action & possession including every thing and property I own or may own at my death of every kind character & description every thing I may possess or be entitled to & hereby intended to be included to her and her heirs executors & administrators. I hereby nominate & appoint my widow sole Executrix to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others. Signed sealed published & declared by me Jonathan Eason in presence of witnesses before signed by writing Martha Hart

A paper writing purporting to be and contain the last will and testament of Jonathan H. Eason deceased dated 15 Feb 1861 witnessed by Simon J. Perry & Wm. C. Elson is exhibited in open court by Martha Eason Executrix Martin named and the due execution thereof proved by the oath and examination of Wm C Elson one of the subscribers whereof witness Simon J. Perry being absent in the army. Upon Motion it is ordered that the said paper writing be recorded and filed at the same time comes Martha Eason the executrix named in said will and declassified as such according to law.

I John J. Sherrill of the County of Martin the State of North Carolina being of sound disposing mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Ann Sherrill five hundred dollars to bear interest from the day of my death Second I desire to my daughter Mary Ann Sherrill the mansion tract of land I purchased of Joshua Taylor containing six hundred acres more or less the northern tract adjoining the same I purchased of Joseph Rawls containing two hundred acres more or less to her and her heirs forever subject to the conditions and stipulations hereinafter made Third My daughter Mary Ann has now my note for thirty four hundred dollars which I gave her sometime since which she is to surrender without payment to my executors and then the lands above named to her and the residue of my real estate are to be divided by three disinterested persons to be chosen by my executors and the whole of my estate of every description is to be equally divided between my said Daughter Mary Ann and my Daughter Nancy Best and Betty Bryan and my Daughter Mary Ann is to account on said division for the value of the said land claimed to her, and if the land claimed to her shall exceed the one third in value of my whole estate, then she is to account out of said lands to my other Daughters a sufficient sum to make them all equal in valuation of course excluding from this division the five hundred dollars legacied bequeathed to my Daughter Mary Ann by the first clause of this will, it being my desire and intention to give her that sum more than my other daughters in consequence of her dutiful conduct to me in my old age Lastly I renounce and appoint my friend Asa Biggs Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills or Testaments made by me
