

Kenneth Daniel's Will

I Kenneth Daniel of the County of Martin & State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but Considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner & form following - That is to say First, that my Executor(hereinafter named) shall pay all my just debts, house rents and to whomsoever coming, out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part and parcel of my estate - Item - I give and bequeath to William M<sup>c</sup> Daniel my son one negro girl named Runina & her increase, One negro boy Orace & one colt given to him & his heirs forever - Item - I give and bequeath to Rosana Daniel my Daughter, One negro girl named Jane, one negro girl named Amanda & her increase & one negro boy named Lewis to her & to her heirs forever - Item - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Daniel all my land and plantation wherein I now live, all of my household & Kitchen furniture, One Gray Mare and Mule, One buggy, one ox and all my Stock of hogs and Cattle to her during her natural life or widow hood - Item - At the Death or widow hood of my wife I give the same to Wm M<sup>c</sup> Daniel my Son all my lands & him & his heirs forever - And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my trust friend George C. Roberson my lawful Executor to execute this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills & testaments by me herefore made October 2<sup>nd</sup> 1861 Kenneth Daniel <sup>test</sup> <sup>mark</sup>

Kenneth B Whiffield's Will

State of North Carolina Known all men by these presents, I said Kenneth B Whiffield, being in sound mind, do this day make my last will and testament - I give to my wife Elizabeth Whiffield all of my property her like time or widow hood and thereafter to my three children James Godfrey, Kenneth Magrory, I want my land equally divided between my two Sons James Godfrey & John James - I give to my daughter Kenneth Magrory five hundred dollars to make her equal with my two Sons - I do not my wife Elizabeth Whiffield to take my business in hand and pay all my just debts I shall leave my wife Elizabeth Whiffield my Executrix to my will Now set my hand and seal in presence of us December 1863

Whiffield and James Colburn - It was ordered and adjudged by the Court, that said paper writing and every part thereof was the last will and testament of said Kenneth B Whiffield - Ordered by the Court that said will & this probate be Recorded - The said Elizabeth Whiffield comes into open Court and Renounces the executorship of the Estate of Kenneth B Whiffield deceased
