I, Kintchen Taylor of the County and

will and Testament in manner and form as follows
It is my wish and desire that my negroes and Stock shall
be kept in the plantation where I now live until my son
Kintchen Taylor attains or arrives to the age of twenty one years
and I give and bequeath unto my two daughters Maria & Sarah
Taylor and Charity Dawson Taylor, my piece of land east of
Land where I formerly lived containing by estimation about
hundred and twenty five acres and them and their heirs forever.
I also give and bequeath unto my son Joshua Taylor one thousand
dollars to be raised from the farm
It is my wish and desire that my Grandson John Andrew Taylor
one negro Boy by name of Robt to him and his heirs forever.
I also give and bequeath unto my son Kintchen Taylor the land
and plantation where I now live and all the rest of my
landed estate not previously disposed of
It is my wish and desire that my three daughters Maria, Rachel
Sarah Taylor Charity Dawson Taylor and my son
Kintchen Taylor to be equally divided between them my negroes
when my son Kintchen arrives to the age of twenty one years
to them and their heirs forever
It is my wish and desire that the residue of my Estate
of every description be given to my son Kintchen Taylor
Charity Dawson Taylor and my son Joshua Taylor
and David C. Gwyther my Executors and furthermore
I authorize and empower them the above named executors Joshua
Taylor and David C. Gwyther to keep the negroes and Stock
in this my married plantation in such manner as they
may think best for my heirs - I also wish and desire
that the above named men as Executors may not be bound
to give bonds for their Executorship
