Then I Give my daughter Mary Collins one fourth
Part — I Give my Loving wife Elizabeth Collins
all my other Estate of every kind after paying my
Just debts & funeral Charges to her during her
natural life, at her death my will is, that the
whole be divided between my two daughters
Carter Speller & Mary Collins and Peggy Dyson
my Granddaughter, in equal shares, but if Peggy
Dyson should die before marriage, or being of
age, then my will is, the whole be divided between
my two daughters Carter Speller & Mary Collins
and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends
Thomas Hyman & Jesse Collins executors of this my
Last Will and Testament in witness whereof
I the said John Collins have to this my Last Will
and Testament set my hand and seal the day and
year under written this 29th day of September 1802

memory thanks be Given unto God calling unto mind the
mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my
Last Will and Testament that is to say principally
and first of all, I Give and recommend my soul unto
the hands of almighty God that Give it and my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my executors & things
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the by the mighty power of God
and touching such worldly estate where with it has
pleased God to Bless me in this life I Give demise
and dispose of the same in the following manner
and form — I Give and bequeath unto my two
sons Matthew and Jesse Hasty all my Lands to be
equally divided between them both and all the
rest of my property to my wife Lydia Hasty her
Lifetime and then to be equally divided among
the rest of my Children at her death —
and I do by these presents constitute and appoint
my Loving wife Lydia Hasty my sole executrix
to this my Last Will and Testament, in witness
whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this
tenth day of March 1803 —
