In the name of God Amen I Ned Hyman being of a sound and disposing mind do make and ordain and publish this my last Will and Testament - I Lead unto Tommy Stees her children and then to her heirs the houses and lots in Williamston that I bought of J. P. Manning and all the lots joining on the west of the street - also one tract of Land that I bought of Jordan Roberson containing two hundred & thirty one and one half - I Lead unto Small Hyman her children and then to her heirs one tract of Land joining Thomas Kings, Billy and mind or wife - also the houses and lots that formerly belong to John Suggan also the houses & two lots that I bought of Edward Colwell due? also one house and lots which John Brooks now lives on and conditions that he Brooks don't pay the sum of thirty five dollars by the first of January 1844 - also one house and lot which Jackson Hill now lives in and the same Jackson Hill pay Fifty Dollars by the first of January 1844. the property is his

I give unto Ned Suggan or Hyman one half of the house and lots which I now live, also the other half at the death of my wife, also half of the Spring Creek tract of Land, also one tract of Land on Route known by the name of the tract - I give and bequest with my daughter Tommy Stees one Bay mare named Gale and three Cows & Calves, the young Stee of Stees and East, also three Tom and Cigs, one Chick Dig & Stamp -

All the balance of my stock and household furniture I give to my son Ned Hyman and to my wife -

I do hereby appoint Standley Gray and Ned Hyman Executors to this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and seal this 10th Eleventh day of February 1840.

backland and improvements in the lands where I formerly lived
I also give and bequeath to my daughter Emily and Susan
Smithwick my inside Island tract of land & improvements -
to be equally divided between them, and to my daughter Susan
I give and bequeath my woman - her's smallest child, and I
also will and desire that all my negroes except the two above
named be equally divided between my blind children I have
Emily Martha & Susan Smithwick, I also give and bequeath
to my blind children Joshua, Emily Martha & Susan Smithwick
one share and sumitend each, it is also my will and desire
that the negroes be held out until my children become of age
and then divide as also named, it is my will that my house
and plantation where I now live be given up to my children
Martha, Emily, Susan and Joshua to live upon until Joshua
become of age, also I give to my children also named
Emily Martha, Emily, Susan and Joshua eight hundred pounds of stock
to live upon the first year, and also will and desire that
the balance and residue of all my estate and property not
before given away sold by my Executors and as much thereof
as is necessary applied to the payment of my just debts
and the remainder equally divided between my blind children
Martha, Joshua, Emily & Susan Smithwick, I also nominate
constitute and appoint Clayton Wood and Thomas I. Hyman
the Executors of this my last will and Testament
