

I, Robert Daniel of the County of Martin being weak in body but of perfect mind & Memory and calling to mind the Mortality that it has appointed for all men come to this do make and Ordain this to be my last will and Testament, this an nulling and revoking all that heretofore made and first, I give my Soul to God that gives it, and my body to be decently buryed according to the direction of my Executors, I then Give and bequeath to my well beloved Son William Daniel Ten Shillings to be raised out of my estate

Then I give to my well beloved Son Simon Daniel Ten Shillings to be raised out of my Estate

Then I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Ten Shillings to be raised out of my Estate

Then I give unto my Daughter Sarah Ten Shillings to be raised out of my estate

Then I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son James Daniel the land and Plantation whereon I now live

Then I likewise give unto my son James Daniel all my Negroes

Then I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Sarah Daniel the first Child that my Negro woman spinah shall have

Then I give to my daughter Eliza Daniel the second Child that my Negro woman spinah shall have

Then I give unto my son Charles Daniel the African Negro Woman Anne and I likewise give unto my son James Daniel a Negro boy called Cove

and as for my old Negro woman called Bess she may have what of all my Daughters she will live with

Then I give unto my Daughter Joseph Daniel the same Cattle that has been called Bess and a feather Bed and Trunk and one Linen Sheet and twenty Shillings hard money

Then I give unto my Daughter Alice Daniel all the more Cattle that is called Bess and one feather Bed and Trunk and one large Chest and twenty Shillings hard money

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Then I give unto my wife Sarah Daniel all the part of my living in door and without to him and his heirs for ever and I hereby bequeath and appoint William Daniel and Simon Daniel my heirs and Paul Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this day and date Above Written Signed Sealed & Delivered in presence of us

In the Name of God Amen the twenty ninth day of October one thousand seven hundred and eighty five I James Loggitt of the province of North Carolina & County of Martin being weak in body but of perfect mind & Memory thank be to God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make & Ordain this my last will & Testament First of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following Manner & Form to Wit, I send to my beloved wife Mary Loggitt my Plantation whereon I now live & two negroes Jack and Anne During her Life or widowhood I then I give and bequeath unto my brother John Loggitt one hundred and twenty three Acres of Land lying on Trout Creek to him and his heirs forever. I send my son in Law Pinckney Jackson the use of Fifty Acres of Land whereon he now lives till the first day of January 1796 Beginning at the head of a bottom in the field thence across the field to a water Oak & across two thence Along David Loggitts line to his Green then East to the New Road thence Along the said Road to where the North Crosses from Pains to Little then down some line to the Beginning of path and then to Pinckney Jacksons line and then lying in between the same term of Time
