7<sup>th</sup> I give unto my grand son Benjamin R. Price & Hardy & his wife  
son of my son Hardy 15. Dine one hundred dollars each to be given  
to the property which I may have on hand to divided.  
8<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Grand son Joseph R. Bryan one Tract of Land  
and same I bought of A. H. & A. M. H. Price containing forty acres  
more or less and all the improvements thereon forever.  
9<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire that the negro I have not given away  
after my death to be equally divided between my heirs in the  
following manner viz; one fifth to Hardy R. Price his wife  
fifth to Cherry Bryan his, one fifth to Rebecca Bryan children  
one fifth to Roxana Bryan her life time and after her death to her  
children one fifth to Mary Johnson her life time and after her  
death to her children leaving & giving my Executor full power  
to appoint Commissioners to allot and divide said negroes between  
to appoint Commissioners to the above statement.  
I give him according to the above statement.  
10<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Daughter Mary Johnson one Tract of Land Known  
as the Johnson Tract containing fifty acres more or less run-  
ning south with the fence to her and her heirs forever.  
11<sup>th</sup> It is my desire that the balance of the land I have not otherwise  
distributed myself except the family Slave shall be sold and Equally di-  
vided between my son Hardy & Price his wife and the heirs of  
Daughter, Rebecca, Cherry, & Roxana in like manner as the  
negroes. 12<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Grand son Joseph R. Bryan  
one Bed and Furniture. 13<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire that my  
Executor sell at public auction my Perishable Estate and after  
paying my just debt, the balance with what money or bonds I  
may have to be Equally divided between the heirs of my son Hardy,  
of Price and the children of my daughter Rebecca and the children  
of my daughter Cherry and Roxana and Mary in like manner  
as the negroes. 14<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire that my Executor, when  
in their hands, if not applied for property before the part of my  
Estate which I give unto my Daughter Roxana and her heirs  
seven years of not applied for in that time then to be Equally di-  
vided between my other heirs. 15<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire that  
my Executor retain in their hands the property which I have  
given unto my Grand children until they arrive to the age of  
Twenty one or married. I do hereby constitute and appoint  
my friends Archibald Stelon and William R. Brown Executors  
to this my last will and Testament revoking all other wills  
that I may have made prior to this date. In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the Twenty second  
day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty three

of fire Tongs one Soap Barrel one meal Barrel & Sifter one  
iron stand one rolling Pin and a sugar box to him & his  
heirs forever also seventy five cents due me by J. Peeler  
Item I give to my Grand Daughter Catharine Cooper one small  
bed half dozen Cams and various size Plates one Little one  
small Table one Bed one Marching Tub three Chairs one bread  
Bak one Skillet one Linen Sheet and one Coffin mill & one  
Sly to her and her heirs forever I hereby make and ordain  
William Cooper Executor of this my last will & Testament  
in witness whereof I Sarah Cook have to this my last will  
and Testament set my hand and seal this the 2<sup>nd</sup> in  
the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and forty
