I give unto my son James B. Correll one Negro woman named Lydia and one
boy white named Randall after my death to him and his heirs forever

Now I give unto my Daughters Sally Courtt one Negro Girl named Deller after
my death to her and her heirs forever
also I give unto my Daughter Sally Courtt the bed and sleed and furnellor that
I lie on after my death to her and her heirs forever.

I live on after my death to be sold and the money to be
 given to my wife, Mellen Everett for pigs belonging to a white slave
 I own all my stock of horses cattle sheep & dogs house hold kitchen furniture
 with all my farming tools of every denomination after paying my said debts
 I give to be Equally divided between Simon Everett Sally Everett & James
 Everett of either of the above named children should die without any lawful
 heirs then my will and desire is that Mary Rebuck wife of Salsburg Rebuck Jr come
 in & take an equal part with the above named children in all their legacy
 except the land then of Simon Everett or James S Everett And as to my
 lawful heirs my will and desire is that the one living shall take the other
 & so it shall be.

My well and desire is that the negro and that I have given to Eliza
Felix and Cissy his his life and John Everett and Samuel
Kalen and Wige Amelia have in their part of my property for me —
And I hereby make and ordain my last will and testament in witness
whereof I the said John Everett at this my last Will &
Testament that my last and seal the day and year above
written.

 daughter Sally Everett.

I then I give to my daughter Mary Kiddick and on that
 part of the Legacy I left to my son Simon I Everett and
 James Everett and Sally Everett in case either of the above
 mentioned Children die without any lawful issue of
 their body.

I Joseph Kiddick of the County of North Carolina and State of North Carolina do
 make and create this my last will and Testament in manner and form
 following: I bind all my home land to my wife Betia Kiddick during
 her widowhood or life then give the part lying on the North side
 of the Gallberry branch, which land I bought of Rice Kiddick
 together with all my personal land next to John Bates from a
 strait line through the possession opposite the mouth of the Gall
 berry branch to my son Benjamin T Kiddick, and give the house
 part lying on the South side of the Gallberry branch and
 a strait line through the possession opposite the mouth
 of Gallberry branch to my son John W Kiddick. I bind
 and bequeath to my son ^{and daughter} Betty Kiddick one negro boy
 named Haven. I bind and bequeath to my son Scott Kiddick
 one negro boy named ^{and daughter} Phillis. I bind and bequeath to my son
 Joseph Kiddick two negro boys one named George and the
 other Anthony. I bind negro girl Hannah to my daughter
 Fanny during her life then give her to two children
 Old negro man Brant I leave to be sold. All the remainder
 of my negroes I leave to my wife Betia Kiddick during
 her widowhood or life then to be equally divided among all
 my children. My stud horse and my mare I leave to be sold
 All the residue of my stock together with every house hold
 and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils I leave to my
 wife Betia during her widowhood or life then to be equally
 divided among my children. I hereby I want a part of the land
 property sold to pay my debts. The tract of land in Blaines town
 and I leave to be sold and the money equally divided among
 my four sons. I nominate constitute and appoint Joseph
 Kiddick and Ebenezer Kiddick Executors of the my last
 will and Testament. hereby moving all other and former
 wills by me at any time heretofore made. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal the seventh day of
 February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and twenty seven
