Item 16 It is my will & desire that the tract of land that is in Halifax County should be rented out until the death of my wife I then sole

Item 17 It is my will and desire and I do command & direct my sons Will & Weatherbie & Henry W Weatherbie and my friend Will R. & Williams executors of this last will and testament in witness whereof they have set their hands and affix my seal this 5th of June 1852

In the name of God Amen I Stephen Lewis of the State of North Carolina and County of Martin being of perfect sound mind and memory do make this the 1st day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty two my last will and testament in manner and form as follows

I just command my soul to God who gave it as to my worldly goods to be disposed of as I shall hereafter direct

Item 1st I leave to my beloved wife Martha Lewis all of my estate both real and personal and furnishable during her life after her death it is my will and desire that all of my estate left to my wife be equal divided between my children and also my grand Son George W. Danner who have fifty four bushels out of my estate after the death of my wife

Item 2d I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Martha Lewis to this my last will and testament with the power to sell any part of my property she may think proper for the purpose of paying my debts or for the support of her self and family either at public or private sale In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first written
