B. Langley and Margaret Willson to be equally divided between them, and should the one survive the other the surviving and living is to share the property to the other and their heirs forever

Lastly I designate constitute and appoint my worthy friend J. B. Langley whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other and former Wills, and in case of the death of my said Executor here to be appointed, I constitute and appoint my friend J. B. Langley Executor
