

Margaret Harris' Will

Whereas Margaret Harris of the County of Martin and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say -

First. That my Executor (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts hereover due & to whomsoever owing out of the money, that may first come into his hands as a part of a parcel of my estate. Item. I give and devise to my beloved son Joseph Harris all my lands, wherein I now live, containing thirty one & half acres more or less, allotted and bounded as follows by Beginning at a corner in Zachariah Harris line running thence along Benjamin's line Robert's line to Wm B. Perry's line to James Williams line thence along his line to Zachariah Harris line, thence along his line to the beginning, being and including all my land with all the improvements, and appurtenances thereto belonging to have and to hold to him the said Joseph Harris, his heirs, executors and assigns forever; also I give and devise to my beloved son Joseph Harris all of my House hold & Kitchen furniture of all and every description whatsoever that I may possess to have and to hold to him the said Joseph Harris his heirs assigns forever. Item. I give and devise to my beloved daughter Elizabeth (wife of Daniel Cutler) Dibby Cents in money to be paid her by my Executor (hereinafter named) within two years after my decease to have and to hold to her own use & benefit forever.

Item I give and devise to my beloved daughter Mary (now wife of Humphrey Griffin) Dibby Cents to be paid in money to her by my Executor (hereinafter named) within ten years after my decease to have and to hold to her said Mary Griffin her own use & benefit forever.

And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son Joseph Harris my sole Executor to all intents & purposes to execute this my last will & testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part & clause thereof, revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me hitherto made. In the name of God. Amen:
I Warren Biggs of the County of Martin and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament -

First I desire that all my debt, should be paid out of my personal estate and the remainder of my I land unto my beloved wife Penelope during her natural life and at her death I give the same in my children, share and share alike, to them & their heirs forever Second I give and bequeath to my wife also one feather bed & furniture her choice the trunk her one Chest Third I lend to my Beloved wife Penelope the land wherein I now live being about Sixty Acres more or less to the term of her natural life and at her death I give the same to my two Sons John & Romulus to be equally divided between them & their heirs forever Fourth I nominate at a point as executor to this my last will & testament my friend George B. Hassel & hereby fully authorise him to carry out the provisions of the same, This 26th day Decr 1856
