

In the name of God Amen I James Hobson of Martin County in the State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory thank be God on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of December 1811 make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following to have and to hold I give unto my well beloved son Henry Hobson one hundred acres of land lying on the upper part of the Great Branch that I purchased of Edward Guffee  
Item give unto my well beloved son John Hobson twenty five acres of land lying him self and Abram his and his wifes slack  
Item I leave unto my well beloved wife Alice Hobson my home land and plantation during her widow hood Item I give unto my two well beloved sons Harmon Hobson and Noah Hobson all my land and plantation &c I am owner of the same that is all ready mention'd also give unto my sons Harmon and Noah all my working tools of all kinds what so ever and each of my two sons Harmon & Noah to have there house build that is land there own at this time it is my will and desire that my daughter Alice Hobson shall have the man that is in her affection and the sum of Twenty shillings to be raised out of my Estate & Item I give unto my daughter many George Ten Shillings Item I give unto my daughter Martha Hobson one George half of Twenty Shillings Item I give unto my daughter millie one hundred Ten Shillings Item I give unto my daughter Anna Hobson eight real of butter that has been said her own and one bed & furniture and at the death of my wife one Linen sheet and one working sheet and lace basket it is my will and desire that all the rest of my property both within doors and without be for the use of my wife while she remains a widow and then to be equally divided between my two sons Harmon Hobson and Noah Hobson and I have by make and record my worthy friend Harmon Hobson of Noah Hobson Executor of this my last will and testament for witness whereof I the said James Hobson to this my last will and testament do my hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered by the said James Hobson the testator as his last will and testament I the presents of us who were present at the time of signing & sealing thereof
