In the Name of God Amen
I William Biggs Esq of the State of North Carolina & county of Martin calling to mind the mortality of man do make
and declare this to be my last will & testament on the twenty eighth day of September in the year of our Lord one
thousand Eight hundred and fifteen in the following form and manner Viz

I leave unto my wife Miller Biggs the use of the Land and Plantation wherein I now live and also the Land
I purchased of Andrew Saunders with the goods & stamp with the Privileges on any of my lands for forever
Lightwood's timber and half the profits of my saw and grist mill also the share of four of my Negroes
so that she chooses one from each child as I have mentioned them also all the Negros and her other
children in particular Likewise and after her Death I dispose of the same as hereinafter mentioned

Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Smithwick my land near the head of Turkey swamp situated at the
head of the stream above being the land on which John Smithwick formerly lived also one third Part &
of two hundred and fifty acres on what is called Gaines Road also my negro man named Luke and my negro
girl named Abby also one case of Beanes with what she has there. R. to her and her heirs forever —

Item I give unto my son Thomas Biggs my land lying below the Head swamp also that Part of my Land
lying Northward of the Branch leading from the main Head to the marsh also thirty one acre on Head swamp
also the Land I purchased of John Williams also the Land I bought of Peter Burlington also my Land in the
fork of the Longleaf swamp also my negro man Pompey and my negro boy Mattie and one feather bed and
furniture and one horse and half the profits of my saw and grist mill and at the Death of my wife
the Land and Plantation wherein I now live and the land I purchased of Andrew Saunders also one half
of my Will and at the death of my wife I give him the other half of my Will all to him and his
heirs forever —

Item I send unto my Daughter Mary Nake during her natural life one third Part of two hundred &
fifty acres or what is called Gaines Road also the Land I bought of John Biggs and one deck also
my Negro woman Rachel and her child Abby and at her Death I give the aforesaid Property to her
children which she may then have with what she has already Received to them & their heirs forever —

Item I give unto my Daughter Lucy Biggs one third Part of two hundred and fifty acres of land on
what is called Gaines Road also the Land called the Estate Land which I Purchased at the
Sheriff's sale also one feather bed & furniture and one walnut Table also my negro girl Shirley
and my negro boy Peter to her and her heirs forever —

Item I give unto my Grandson William Smithwick son of John Smithwick seventy five acres of
Land that I Purchased of Robert Warren to him and his heirs forever —

Item I send unto my Daughter-in-law Millery Biggs widow of my son William Biggs the Owning
of my land wherein she now lives along my land Bought of the heirs of Wiley Postwood during
her widowhood and gives unto her what my son William Biggs had Received from me in
his lifetime

Item I give unto my Grandson Joseph Biggs son of my son William Biggs the Land Purchased of the heirs
of Wiley Postwood to enter in the Plymouth thereof at the age of twenty one years to him and
his heirs forever —

Item I give unto my Grandson John Biggs son of my son William Biggs all my land adjoining my old
mill seat Northly of the Back swamp and the land old mill seat and fifteen acres inclusive
of swamp on the east side of said old mill seat so as to join the offa lone and also the
swamp Between said Land on the west and south side with the mill stones laying on
the mill seat and my other Machines now at my other mill to enter into the Plymouth thereof
at the Death of his mother or his Marriage to him and his heirs forever —

Item I give unto my Grandson James Biggs son of my son William Biggs that Part of my
land on which my son William Biggs formerly lived Beginning at the mouth of
the Branch three up the Branch twenty yards above the old mill there
a straight corner to the Back lines to a Standing large pine in said Back
