following in the first place I command my soul into the hands of God my maker
hoping & believing that through the merit of Jesus Christ my Saviour it will be
made perfect here of life ever lasting and my body to the earth whereof it is made
2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth B. Ruffin all the negro slaves
which belonged to her before we were married and then of them in number like wise I give
and bequeath to my said wife all my house hold and kitchen furniture I had unto
my wife all my other negroes during her widowhood at the expiration of that time
I give & bequeath the said negroes to my Brother Thomas Ruffin Henry Ruffin and James
Ruffin and my sister Sarah King as the above negroes will have to be sold to make in
equal division it is my will and desire that they shall chose their own masters or
myself to buy them this to be left to my executors I want as much of pecuniary property
to be sold as will satisfy all the just demands against me I hereby constitute and appoint
myself Thomas Ruffin & William W. Ward executors to this my last will & Testament
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day February
1817 sign'd & delivered in the presence of us Starkey Ruffin & seal

horse and two other horses Namely the rest of my land have to my sons Lee Brown
and William Brown to be equally divided between them after my wife is dead
Namely give my son Lee Brown one feather bed & furniture

Samuel W. and Joseph G. Carraway I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife one horse two
cows and calves one bed and furniture one chest one black wrenut table two looking glasses
one dining chair & harness to the her heirs her executors former sales and her all of my house
furniture or as much as she wishes to keep of it as long as she lives length then to return to
all it is my will and desire that all the rest of my lands and etc be sold by my executors on
a credit of one year and two years and that with the rest of my Estates not before mentioned
to be equally divided between my four children viz Nancy Carraway David Carruthers
Carruthers Samuel Whethay Carruthers & Joseph G. Carraway lastly I constitute and
appoint my friends Durham Davis and Peter Whethay Carruthers to this my last will and
testament hereby Proving and Discharging all former wills by me made and satisfying
and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th of February 1817
