Martin County — I do the name of God Amen & William Ellis of the province and county aforesaid willing to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for Man once to die, do make Ordain Constitute and appoint this to be my last will and testament in the following manner first I recommend my selfe into the hands of God who gave it and my Body to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner and as touching these Mortal Goods that god has blessed me with I give and dispose of as follows — Item I give unto my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Ellis my Dwelling Plantation and the all the Lands there unto belonging and all of my Estate of Every kind During of her life or widowhood —

Item I give unto my Son Shurrod Ellis all my lands after the death of my wife Elizabeth Ellis, to him and to his heirs for ever — Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Shurrod five Shillings to her and to her heirs for ever —

Item I give unto my daughter Lydia Lightfoot five Shillings to her and to her heirs for ever — Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Joyce or her heirs five Shillings to them and other heirs for ever —

This my Will and Testam is that after the Death of my wife Elizabeth Ellis all the remainder of my Estate that is not already willed away, Should be Equally Divided between my Daughters — Dicah Ellis and Olive Cherry and Franky Mighan and my Son Shurrod Ellis — I likewise Nominate and appoint Warren Andrews the Executor to this my last will and testament Revoking and disannulling all other Wills here to fore by me made Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I the said William Ellis hath hereunto put my hand and Seal the fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five — Signed Sealed Published and proven to be my last will and testament in the presence of

I bind to marry, Shurrod daughter of Robert Shurrod deceased during her natural life, the following negroes to wit — Franky, Dick, Amy & Anna, Pat, Dely, Charity Lydia Harry and Nancy — Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to William Shurrod Son of Robert Shurrod eighty five Pounds, to be paid by my executors out of my Estate in other 3<sup>d</sup>. As a mark of my particular esteem and in consideration of the many friendly offices which he has done me, I give and bequeath to Andrew Joyce three Hundred Dollars to be raised and paid him out of my Estate by my executors —

Item 4<sup>t</sup> I give and bequeath to my natural Son Thomas Monk and his lawfull issue after my just debts are paid the negroes beamed to Mary Shurrod after her Death and all my lands and the appertinences therunto belonging, of whatsover description or wheresoever situated in as full and ample manner as each tract was Separately described in this instrument for ever — I further give and bequeath to the said Thomas Monk and his lawfull issue for me all the remainder of my property of every kind description without any limitation or restriction whatsoever — It is my will and desire that my natural Son Thomas Monk Should have the management (for his Benefit) of the negroes left to Mary Shurrod until she is either married or arrives at a lawful age — And I have by constitute and appoint Andrew Joyce and Thomas Monk executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused my seal to be thereto affixed the nineteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twelve signed in the presence of
