Know all men by these Presents that I William Lamb
 of the State of North Carolina in the County of Martin
 for and in Consideration of the sum of Two Thousand
 Two Hundred Pounds Current Money of the State of North Carolina
 to me in hand Paid by Thomas Hunter of the County of Martin
 and at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents
 into the Receipt whereof the Clerk Acknowledges and
 thereof do Acquiesce and Discharge him the said Thomas
Hunter his heirs and Executors Administrators and Assigns
 have Bargained sold and Delivered unto the said
Thomas Hunter and by these Presents do Bargain
 sell and Deliver unto the said Thomas Hunter his
 heirs and Assigns for Ever One Negro Man Slave
 called Philip also One Negro Man Slave called Ben
 To Have and to hold the said Negro Philip Men
 unto him the said Thomas Hunter his heirs Executors
 Administrators and Assigns for Ever and the said
William Lamb for my self my heirs Executors Administrators
 do warrant the above Bargained Negroes unto him
 the said Thomas Hunter his heirs Executors for Ever
 against me my heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns
 and against the lawful claim or demand of any
 Person or persons whatsoever in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand seal this twenty sixth day
 of February in the year One Thousand seven hundred
 and Eighty

 Being Wicked of Body Out of perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God
 for the same and knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to die and that my Last Will and Testament in manner
 and form following First I Commend my soul unto the Hands of God
 the Father and my Body I Commend to the Earth to be buried in the
 Burial Place of the said Martin County to the Discretion of my Executors and as touching
 such worldly Estate whomever it shall please God to Bless me with
 in this life I Give and Dispose of in manner and form following
 I Give unto my Loving Wife Judith During her Life
 the use of a Negro man Ben also one Cow one Horse one Saddle
 and the Stock of Cattle Belonging to the Plantation whereon
 Now Live and the Stock of Hogs on the said plantation together
 with the furniture whereon they Live on and for the better to be
 paid out the Stock of Cattle and Hogs belonging to the said plantation
 I Give unto my Daughter Priscilla Black & white plantation
 on Maple Swamp in Martin County and all the Stock of Cattle
 and Hogs thereon Belonging with a feather Bed and two other
 Made Linens & when I shall pass I Give unto my Daughter
Priscilla Black & white plantation to her heirs and Assigns
 one new Iron pot and a house of Cattle one small Churn and pot
 I Give unto my son William Black & white plantation to be
 paid out of my Estate I Give my son William Black & white
 to his heirs &c.

I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Black & white plantation
 called the Downy plantation money I Give unto my
 Daughter Elizabeth Black & white plantation to be paid out of my
 I Give unto my Daughter Priscilla Black & white plantation
 and my said Daughter has her heirs and Assigns

Then. And as for the remaining part of the Goods & Goods then
said to be Divided Equally between my Wife & my Daughter
Dagges & Phillis Bland.

Then it is my Will that the five pounds left to my Daughter
Elizabeth Bayant be paid out of the Stock of cattle & Hags.
Left to my Daughter Phillis Bland.

Then I Give to my Daughter Dagges Bland. Six new purple
Woolen Shirts the value of the Goods was mentioned and if Case my
said Daughter Phillis Bland should die without issue then
then the said Goods & Chattels to be Given to her sister
Elizabeth Bayant to her her Heirs and Assigns forever I.
do hereby Appointe Ordo to Bayant and Nicholas Bayant
my Executors of this my Last Will and Testaments.

in the State of North Carolina being of Sound & perfect Mind &
Memory (thanks be to God) but willing to mind the Mortality
of Mankind & knowing it is Appointed for all men once to Die
Do Make certain Constitutions & Appoint this my Last Will and
Testaments in Manner & Form following to wit:-

First I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Catherine Booth the place
whereon I now live and all the Land & Tenements Belonging to
her & her Heirs or Assigns forever.

Then I Give and Bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Booth during her
Lifetime the Reparation of my whole Estate consisting of
Every Third What I earn and after her Marriage & Death I
Give the Remainder of my Estate to be Equally Divided
between my 3 Wives & her Heirs & Assigns and my Daughter Catherine Booth
to her Heirs or Assigns forever and then I Make

the said Mary Marmate Constituted & Appointe Thomas Marmate
Philip Bayant Executors to this my Last Will & Testaments then
writing & Discharging this Constitutions by me made & ratified
which I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 24th day
of June 1790 at Newbern & Eighty
