Item - I in my will and devise that all of my property which I have not disposed of including my money & Bonds shall be equal divided between my wife Pamel Clark my son William Clark & my Grandson John Clark to them and their heirs forever -

Item - I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Moore Executor to this my last will and Testament in which I have hereunto set my hand and seal the year & day within written

In the name of God Amen I William Robinson of the County of Martin and State of North Carolina being made in body and sound health and spirit though I might my perfect mind and memory to make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner & form following during my full former sole made by me at any time

Item - I lend to my blood wife Sally Robinson one negro man named Pidding one named Major one named Isaac one negro woman named Phe and I also give to my wife all of my household and kitchen furniture, I also lend to my wife Sally Robinson, one riding Chair, all the land between my son Sam & Pige on East her place all the bottom my Bonds of gold at Yarnway one mare and Colt one or two some more -

2 Item - I lend to my Daughter Sarah Andrews & Aldridge Andrews one negro Girl named Sissy during this natural life and then to her children -

3 Item - I lend to my Daughter Emeline Daniel one negro Girl named Sissy during her natural life and then to her children -

4 Item - I give to my son Wm. H. Robison one negro Boy named John, I also give my son Wm. H. Robison all of my land, money & other things but he is not to have the land until the death of his mother -

5 Item - I give to my son George C. Robison one negro Boy named Robert one cow & calf one feather Bed & furniture of iron Stock of Beef -

6 Item - I give to my son Henry C. Robison one negro Boy named John -

7 Item - I lend to my Daughter Elizabeth, one negro woman named Sarah one cow & calf, one feather Bed and furniture from Stock of Beef -

Item - I lend to my Daughter Sally Ann Robison one negro Girl named Estimond one cow & calf, one feather Bed and furniture from Stock of Beef -

I also lend to my wife the balance of my Cattle & sheep on the balance of my Bonds and at the death of my wife I leave Windsor Robison Isaac & Pige one negro named Alexander one named Dawson one named Hardy one named David to be equally divided among my four children and I also leave one negro Boy named Joe to be paid out till my daughter Elizabeth be sixteen years of age and the hire to be divided between Sally & Elizabeth, but if Elizabeth get married Sally Ann & Pige shall have the hire of all my four children, and I leave one negro Girl Lissa for the hire to be as they think proper, and if either of the children Rogers should die before the Division I want them to have another in its place, I want my exp. of Disposition carried out, and the

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money to go to the aid of paying my just Debt - I want my Son
George E. Robison to carry in my crop of corn and to draw his share
and all of my property not named I want sold and the money
to go to the aid of paying my just debts.

I do here nominate and appoint my son Wm Robison
Counsellor to the my last will and Testament witnesses whom

within and out doors which I will say house hold
and kitchen furniture Farming utensils and
all stock of Cattle Hogs &c. these are my lawful
 heirs & others that I have which is not named in
this my last will but have had a share of
my property previous to this time therefore what is
contained in this will it is my desire for it to
stand as I have stated above therefore I hereunto
do set my hand and seal before these witnesses in the
year of our Lord & 21st day of October 1845
