 Mrs - I give my wife and heirs that all of my property which I have not disposed of including my money & Bonds shall be equally divided between my wife Fannie Clark my Son William Clark & my Grandson John Clark to them and their heirs forever -
 Mrs - I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Hesp^r Morris Councill to this my last will and Testament Executor whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the year & day written written

 I give & send to my beloved wife Sally Johnson
 One acre of land lying on named River one acre
 I gave one acre of land named River and I give her to my wife
 and my household & kitchen furniture, Table cloths & my
 wife Sally Johnson, on Riding Chair, all the Gold Silver
 Trays, two Small Pigs on back two pence all the Cotton
 in my Banks of gold at yearning One man and Colds on to
 some horses

2 I give & send to my Daughter Sarah Andrews
 & Aldridge Andrews One acre of land lying during
 the natural life and then to her children -

3 I give & send to my Daughter Caroline Daniel
 One acre of land lying during her natural life and then
 to her children -

4 I give & send to my Son W. H. Roberts One acre
 of land named River, I also give my Son W. H. Roberts all of my
 Land, from of Adam River & other but he is not to have the said
 Land till the death of his mother -

5 I give & send to my Son George C. Roberts One acre
 of land & cedar on land of one feather 12^o of furniture
 I give Stock of Bees -

6 I give & send to my Son Henry S. Roberts One acre
 of land named River & one Cow & Calves, One feather Bed and
 furniture from Stock of Bees -

7 I give & send to my Daughter Elizabeth, One acre
 of land named River & one Cow & Calves, One feather Bed and
 furniture from Stock of Bees -
 I give & send to my Daughter Sally Ann Johnson
 One acre of land named Johnson's one Cow & Calves, One feather
 Bed and furniture from Stock of Bees -

I also leave to my wife the balance of my cattle & sheep &
 the balance of my Bees and at the death of my wife I leave
 Miss Lydia Isaac & 10^o One Negro named Alexander, One
 Negro One named Hardy and named Waggon to be
 equally divided among my Seven Children, and I also leave
 one Negro Boy named Joe to be held not till my daughter Sally die
 for sixteen years of age and the hire to be divided between Sally & her
 & Elizabeth, but if Elizabeth gets married Sally comes to have the said
 hire afterwards and when Sally dies her Son Joe to go to her
 to the next best Children, and I leave One negro Girl Liss for
 the Son to be as they think proper, and of either of the children
 Negro should die before the Division, I want them to have another
 in its place, I want my executors to have and to command and the

money to go to the end of paying my just debts - I want my Son George E. Robison to carry on my crop of Corn and to drive the Slave and all of my property not named I want sold and the money to go to end of paying my just debts.

I do here nominate and appoint my son W. D. Robison Executor to this my last will and Testament witnesseth whereof I set my hand and seal this the 19th day of April 1845

health and knowing that it was once appointed for
all flesh to die I have therefore thought proper to
make this my last will and Testament not being
under the influence of any person or persons but for the
love and affection that I bear for my Daughters
Nancy Harrison, Fanny Harrison and Sarah Peal
do give and bequeath unto them Two feather Beds to
be divided between them there say Nancy, Fanny, and
Sarah also Two Chests One Table one of which have
a drawer the other a long Table all of my Slaves, and gear
one pulter dish and one huckle all of the above named
property I do give and bequeath unto my Daughters
above named to be equally divided between them.

I do for the love and affection that I have for
my son Henry Biggs I do give and bequeath
unto him all the balance of my property both
within and out doors which I will say house hold
and Kitchen furniture, Farming utensils and
all stock of Cattle Hogs &c these are my lawful
hers & others that I have which is not named in
this my last will but have had a share of
my property previous to this time therefore what is
contained in this will it is my desire for it to
stand as I have stated above therefore I herein
do set my hand and seal before these witnesses in the
year of our Lord & 21st day of October 1845
