In the Name of God Amen. I Abraham Taylor being weak in body
but of perfect sound memory & judgment, and calling to mind the mortality
of my body, that it is appointed for all men here to die, have therefore
thought fit to make this my last will & testament, thereby desirous to
make void all other wills & testaments by me herebefore made,
& done of habitation hinder from habitation; And first I recommend
my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian & decent manner at
the discretion of my executors, and my soul to God that gave it me
in hopes of a gracious reception through my Lord & Saviour Jesus
Christ. And next I will & appoint that all my Hospital Ditts be paid
Item. I will & bequeath unto Mary Taylor my loving wife her several
thirds of all my personal & moveable Estate. I also will bequeath unto
my wife during her life time this tract of land of 75 acres on which
I now live as also this other tract of land, bearing this of 125 acres which
bequeathed & left to me by my sister Jane Taylor now deceased to hold &
enjoy the said lands with all its profits whatsoever belonging to
the same whilst she my said wife lives upon condition that she my
said wife gives up all her right of Dower or profit which by law may
by her be claimed of all the rest of my land to the proper Heirs & legatees that
I now have now willed it to or to any acting for them in their names
by proper authority. But if it is not given up as above said I will that
she my said wife shall only have such profits of the said land as the
law allows her in the first place & no more to her share of the same
with child bearing. And then this child shall take the whole & sole

of this her life die without her or those of her ever body that then the
said land shall fall to the highest heir, law of my blood family, &

containing 147 acres & be bequeath by my executors at their discretion
How many therefrom arising to be equally divided among the
children named children & part out at bequeath by my executors in
each legatee shall come of age to receive their part. I also will
& bequeath unto my well beloved sister Margaret Hudson son and
sons viz Daniel Hudson, John Hudson, William Hudson & the under
Hudson two tracts of patent Land containing in the whole of the two
tracts four hundred acres of Land be the same more or less lying on the
waters of the South fork of the Catawba river as described in said
Patents lying near said Daniel Hudsons. & in the non personal
of Brook last formerly named however, I also appoint that the said
land be equally divided among the rest of the legatees that are left
I also bequeath John Taylor my brother of Mecklenburg. my
Ex't of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have

hereunto set my hand & seal this 21st day of April 1778

 equally divided between them. I also will unto Jane Lee wife of
 James Lee my Young Servt her three years old in trust whereupon

 I Joseph Tamm in No^o Carolina Mecklenburg County (will
 w^rite) being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind &
 memory thanks be given to God. Therefore calling to mind
 the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will
 & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give &
 recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that you
 & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a de-
 cent Christianlike manner according to the discretion of my
 executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I
 shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as
 touching such worldly Estate wherein with it hath pleased God
 to bless in this life, I give & dispose of the same in the following
 manner & form, And I order that all my just debts and
 funeral charges be fully paid & satisfied. Item I give & bequeath
 unto my beloved wife Anna Tamm the third of all my movable
 Estate & her Household & her bed & Bed clothes & all the
 household furniture & the negro woman called Jeannette living
 on or about of this Plantation & the two Miles as she thinkes more
 proper during her widowhood— Item I give & bequeath unto
 my eldest daughter Elizabeth Reed five hundred— Item I give &
 bequeath unto my son John Tamm one hundred acres of land—
