 one Shilling Sterling, I constitute of this my last Will
 Testament, John Reid & David Miller Executors -

32 In the name of God Amen. 7th day of April 1785. I James
 Thompson of the County of Merchenburg & State of N^o Carolina
 being, after sickness & weak my body & of perfect memory, turned
 to God for his mercies, therefore calling to mind the Mortal-
 ity of my body & knowing that it is appointed, or all men
 are to die, do make this & declare this my last Will & Testa-
 ment it is today principally & first of all I give & recommend my
 Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it & my body
 I recommend to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my friends
 nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall
 receive the same again by the hand of God, As touching my
 worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
 with in this life I give & divide & dispose of the same in
 the following manner & for my Executors I give & bequeath
 to my five youngest children Joseph Thompson, Benjamin
 Thompson, Moses Thompson & E Thompson & Aaron
 Thompson all my Estate at their Mothers decease & the
 decease of my wife to be equally divided amongst them to
 rest of my children the sum of one Shilling Sterling apiece
 for they have had their share before. I do advise constitute this
