Susannah my under bed & bedstead together with all my wearing
apparel or clothing of every kind which I am possessed of. Also
I give unto said Susannah my spinning wheel with one pair
of fine Dags. - 2^d. I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter
Violet Rankin my Walnut Table. 3^d. I give & bequeath unto
my Grand daughter Nelly Rankin my good Dutch Oven & my
flax Hackle. 4th. The remainder & Reminders of my estate I give
& bequeath unto my Daughter Susannah after burying my mo-
ral body in a Christian & decent manner who shall have may be
in my Grandsons or other hands. Wherefore I do ap-
point my two trusty friends David Wilson, & Thomas Bailey to exe-
cute this my last Will & Testament, & I do the by these presents.

Disannul & make void all other & former Wills & Testaments by me made & published. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 19th day of June 1807.

Executor & that all my lawful Debt be paid out of the same
and that the balance if any to said Executor use, and further
I do declare & appoint my beloved son John Davis to execute
this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day
of June in the year of our Lord 1807.
