 George live together & keep house that my negro boy
 George is to stay with them & to them for their support, & in
 case they break up & leave the place, I allow him to be sold
 & that the proceeds be equally divided among my sister Patsy's
 children. I appoint & constitute Abraham Robinson my
 brother-in-law Executor of this my last will & Testament.

In the name of God Amen, I Agnes Potts of the State of N. Carolina
 & County of Wake, being there the owner of a sound
 & disposing mind & memory & calling to recollection that this is
 certain & the time to end in death. Do make & declare this my
 last will & Testament as the word of God in following viz

 & to the heirs of her body my negro woman named Abner & her two
 youngest children Jacob & Rebecca. I give & bequeath to
 my daughter Grace Crockett my negro woman named Jenny
 to her & the heirs of her body, Then I give & bequeath to my daughter
Peggy Robinson & to the heirs of her body my negro boy named
Then I give & bequeath to my daughter Susan Pitt & to the heirs of
 her body my negro woman Cynthia. Then I give & bequeath to
my daughter Elizabeth Hamilton & to the heirs of her body my
 negro boy named Wilson. Then I give & bequeath to my daughter
Polly Robinson & to the heirs of her body my negro girl Violet
Then I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy Jordan & to the
 heirs of her body my negro boy named Then I give & bequeath to
my daughter Caroline Pratt & to the heirs of her body my negro boy
 named Joe.

I give & bequeath to my only son William Potts fifty
 dollars to be paid him with all my money then this my wife
 & I don't think my negro woman subject to all her old and
 that her price together with the proceeds of her house all my pro-
 perty of every kind and nature to be as one in that my last will
 & all the monies in my possession taken me after my first death &
 funeral expenses are paid ~~to be equally divided~~ ^{to be} divided between
 my eight daughters Anna, Elizabeth, Jane, Constance, Prissy,
Robinson, Marion, Elizabeth, Harriet, Polly, Robinson,
Marion, Elizabeth, Harriet, Polly, Robinson,
 property of these my daughters & the third of these Prissy -
 Lastly I appoint William Potts my son in law of mine -
 Executor sole executor of this my last will & testament and
 he to keep the same & to have the same set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 3rd day of March 1830

 chair to be freely proposed & enjoyed - Second I will & bequeath
 to my grand daughter Polly William one bed & furniture, also
 my grand daughter Elizabeth & her by her to be freely proposed
 & enjoyed, Third I will & bequeath to the bodily heirs of my
 grand daughter Polly William a negro girl named
Ann which said girl I have increased & allow to be sold
