hand this 11th December 1789

Proved in Court January Term 1790.

Mecklenburg County N. Carolina Feb^y 16th 1795.
I, Alexander Robison of the County of Mecklenburg in the State of
N. Carolina be in body but disabled by God in the regular use of
reason, make this my last Will & Testament, I commit my body
to the dust & my soul to God the great Creator humbly hoping
for pardon & acceptance through Christ the Saviour of sinners
I do hereby constitute & appoint my two brothers Matthew Robi-
son & David Robison Executors of this my will. My will is that my
plantation principally lying on the N. side of Pawcreek in this
County joining the lands of George Cuthbert, John Beatty &c. be sold
by my Executors & the money arising from the sale be distributed
as follows in the following manner Fifty pounds to my
Father & Mother. Twenty five pounds to my sister Mary -
Ten pounds to Mary the daughter of Matthew Robison - Ten pounds
to Mary the daughter of Andrew Corman - Ten pounds to Mary
the daughter of Isaac Flavin - Ten pounds to Sarah the daughter
of John Swain - Ten pounds to my sister Sarah Patterson
Also my will is that all my cloths be paid out of the Re-
mainder and should there be any money arising from the sale
of the land still remaining, my will is that it be divided
equally between my three brothers Matthew David & Richard
Robison - Also I give & bequeath my black men to my Father
Richard Robison - Also I give & bequeath my gray horse to my
sister Mary Robison - Also I give & bequeath my bay horse to
my brother Matthew Robison - Also my will is that my
sarah man be sold & her price equally divided between my
three brothers David & Richard Robison. This is my
last Will & Testament & I am hereunto set my hand
as a testimony of the same on the day month & year abo-
