all my children, And I do hereby constitute & appoint
my son John Henry & my son in law Leonard Lips & my
witness friend Robert Johnson Esq? to be my sole executors
to this my last will & Testament, disannulling all &
every will & legacy by me made before & unexecuted
before Ratifying this & no other to in my last will &
Testament, be witness whereof the said John Andrew
Henry hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal this
15th day of April 1809 -

In the Name of God Amen: I the undersigned citizen of the
State of North Carolina in Mecklenburg County, being in
perfect mind & memory thank be to God, calling to
mind the Mortality of the body & knowing that it is
appointed for all men here to die, Do make & declare
this my last will & Testament, That is to say principally
& first of all, I give & recommend myself unto the hand
of Almighty God that gave it, from body I recommend
to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the
discretion of my children nothing al other but at the
general resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God, but as touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it hath been pleased God to bestow me with
in this life, I dispose of the same in the following manner
First I give & bequeath to my son Andrew Wallace

all that piece or parcels of Land tenement houses & other
 &c leave William Griffiths & Alexander Wallace old tract supposed
 to contain twenty two acres all my notes bonds & judgments
 also all my clothing bed & bedding. Secondly I give &
 bequeath to my Grandson Alexander Lassance Wallace
 my living room called by to be his. 3rd and lastly I do
 appoint John Wallace Alexander Wallace to execute
 this my last will & Testament, and I do revoke, disan-
 nul & make void all former wills whatsoever made by
 me before to day my last will & Testament, be witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand this 9th day of May 1807
 in presence of John Wallace { Alexander Wallace 
Thomas S. Brantley }

In the name of God, I James May knowing myself old
 & know that I must depart this life soon. This in a good
 state of health at present I do declare this my last will &
 Testament that is to say my will is that the half of my
 estate be put out at interest & that my wife Catherine
 receive the income yearly & every year for her support
 during her natural life & at her death to descend as
 hereafter directed & give & bequeath to my wife son
James Griffiths all the rest of my estate to him his heirs
 & assigns forever. Also that part I left to his mother to
 take at her death Lastly I do declare & constitute
 & appoint my wife son James Griffiths who & she
 shall be trustee of this my last will & Testament, be witness
 my hand & seal this 9th day of January in the year of
 our Lord 1807.
