


... & the last will & Testament of the Monies arising

executors of this my last will & Testament at the same time
executing & destroying all & several former wills or
testaments made by me before this date of I have now come to
execute my new & entire will at this 8th day of Janst 1819

James Hobart,

In the Name of God Amen. This 11th day of June 8 year of our Lord
Eighteen hundred & sixteen, I, John Rock being weak of body, . . . to
make & publish my Will & Testament this 11th day of June 1816, &
knowing that it is appointed for all men. Do make and
execute this my last Will & Testament, and first by giving my soul
to God that gave it me, & for my body committed to the
earth to be buried in a Christian decent manner by my
executors here after named, and as touching my worldly
affairs as it has pleased God in this life to bless me with I
give devise & bequeath in the following manner following and
first it is my will that all my funeral expenses & just debts
be honestly paid — Then I will to my beloved wife Eliza
Elizabeth Birney during her life and then I will
to my beloved son John Rock one half of my
share plantation in Lincoln County my negroes, such
& every slave I may have then I will to my beloved son James
my plantation on which I live & my house son, son
& my son's wife to whom called John Rock —
Then I will to my beloved son John the other
share plantation in Lincoln County & so as my heirs

Item 5. I will to my beloved Daug^r wife Polly G. my negro
 girl a Harry - Item 6. I will to my beloved son John G. five
 hundred acres of my land in the state of Kentucky & negro
 boy George Item 7. I will to my beloved Daug^r Lucy G. my
 negro girl & boy Catharine & Christopher G. I will to my sister in
 law Jane above fifty dollars per month for her maintenance &
 my cattle - Item 10. I will my sister Elizabeth Dobbins the
 land on which she now lives for her maintenance & to be
 for her use during her natural life; and it is my will that my
 sons continue to live on my plantation & to try to take care of
 my beloved wife & it is my will that the following negroes be
 kept to work on the farm Silvey Sam, Sarah & Peter, and it is
 my will that all my property not mentioned be divided
 amongst my children so that they have all as near an
 equal part of my property as can be apportioned and I
 will my executors to my beloved sons William & Josephine G.
 and it is my will that all my beloved children be made
 good English scholars - and I constitute ordain & appoint
 my Brother Joseph Reed & friend Robert Green executors
 of this my last will & testament, publishing & proclaiming
 this & no other my last will & testament before sealed &
 delivered in the presence of us who signed in the presence
 of each other this 11th June 1816 - "

 Settlement in Kentucky County & State of Kentucky being
 at present weak in body but of sound disposing mind
 memory helped by God, troubling to mind the mortality of the
 body & that it is appointed unto all men once to die & on
 & declare in this my last Will & Testament in manner & in
 following first recommend my soul to god who gave
 my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like
 & decent manner at the discretion of my executors in
 in other respects - And touching such worldly estate
