I give & bequeath to my beloved son Andrew Baxter his Heirs &  
Affairs, seven thousand dollars, D. & D. Sixty acres of Land by Deed from  
John Davis . Ninety five by a Deed from Henry Easton McCullough &  
forty two acres by Patent from the King and one hundred acres to  
be taken off the lower end of the tract purchased of Mr. St. L. St.  
to be added to the tract I bought of John Davis & fifty acres of  
the tract of John Davis and added to the said line of the tract I  
bought of William St. L. Likewise I give to my beloved son  
Andrew Baxter one horse colt which is now called his and  
Likewise thirty pounds in money — Item I give & bequeath to my  
beloved son James Baxter his Heirs & Affairs for use the tract of land  
whereon I now live there being four hundred & eighty nine acres  
of the tract being to it & some taken from it, Likewise I give  
my beloved son James Baxter one horse colt & the pig, bacon &

It is my will that my children shall be Schooled & learned to read  
writ & Arithmetic as far as the rule of three or further if  
possible, and the quiet rents of my Lands to be paid

of to the best advantage, and after all expenses I just debts paid  
to be equally divided among my three sons viz. John B. Berry  
Adam Banks & Sam'l. Berry in lots of plow Lands & other  
Property excepted which I leave, in the care of the Plantation  
for my wife — And I do hereby constitute & appoint

Ezra Alexander & Henry Burns as my executors of this my  
last Will & Testament, and I do renounce all other Wills, What  
ever — Given under my hand & seal & dated at my last  
Will & Testament this 23<sup>d</sup> day of November 1775.

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Berryhill of the  
County of Mecklenburg State of Carolina being very sick  
and weak in body, but of perfect mind & memory having done to God  
calling to mind the mortality of the body thence going, that it  
is appointed, for all mankind is this, to make & publish this  
my last Will & Testament this, in accordance my last  
into the hand of Almighty God who gave it, and my body  
I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian  
Burial at the discretion of my executors, and according  
such mortuary Entombment as it shall please God to  
allow me with in this life. I give, nominate & dispose of  
in the following manner given — Viz

And first of all I do order that all my Estate both real  
& personal in said at present to be sold after all my just  
debts are paid. I also order that the rest of my Estate  
be divided as follows —

To my Brother William Berryhill I do leave One hundred  
Dollars in the summae after my debts are paid  
I add to my dears Jane, Polly, Sally, Margaret & Anna a sume  
to each of them the sum of ten Dollars, and my wife Elizabeth  
I give with one dollar, next to Miles for fifty & then rate  
as wills the sum of 800
