Iethalrew Bigham of Mecklenburg County in the State of North Carolina, being sick & in a low state of health, but of sound mind & memory, calling to mind the apparent disposition of my body, do make & ordain this my last will & testament. That is to say principally first of all I give my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors, land as touching such worldly estate whereon the it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Will Give, Bequeath & dispose of the same in the following manner & mannerly, I will give & bequeath to my beloved wife Agnes Bigham a sufficient Allowance & maintenance out of my estate during life or widowhood —

Item I will & ordain that all my estate real & personal be appraised & valued. That my executors at their discretion dispose of such a part thereof as may be sufficient to pay all my just debts —

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Andrew Bigham the sum of Ten Shillings

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Anna Patten a sum to help provide the woman to her husband —

Item I further will, give & bequeath unto every the remainder of my estate real & personal to my beloved sons & daughters, William Bigham, John Bigham, Samuel Bigham, Henry Bigham —

Item It is my further will to pleasure the the said remainder of my estate real & personal be continued in one common Stock until one or more of Legatees or their guardian shall call for a division thereof then the said real & personal according to the appraisement with the increase therof be equally divided & one fourth part delivered into the hands of each of the Residuary Legatees as may call for their division & when the said remainder shall be equally divided together with the increase thereof and equal proportion thereof delivered to the said Residuary Legatee or Legatees provided always that nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of the wife of the said Andrew Bigham Esq. of Mecklenburg in <sup>one fourth of the</sup> residue of the said Residuary Legatee to come had & to hold the same in the common Stock or Residue

into the hands of a thoroughly Godly who gave it, being Godly I doom  
myself to the Earth to be buried in a decent maner at the did  
creation of my ancestors, and as touching such wortly estate  
whereas the it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Will

Give, Bequeath & dispose of the same in the following manner & form  
imprimis I Will give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Bigham a  
sufficient & decent maintenance out of my estate during life  
or widowhood —

Item I Will & declare that all my estate real & personal be appraised  
& valued. That my executors at their discretion dispose of such a  
part thereof as may be sufficient to pay all my just debts —

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son William Bigham the sum of  
Five Millings

Item I Give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Patten a sum to  
help provide the woman to her self —

I further Will, give & bequeath unto every the residuary legatee of my  
estate real & personal to my beloved sons & daughters, William  
Bigham, John Bigham, Samuel Bigham, Victory Bigham —

Item It is my further Will & pleasure that the said Residuary of my estate real  
& personal be continued in one common Stock until one or more of  
legatees or their guardian shall call for a division that then the said  
real & personal according to the appraisement with the increase  
thereof be equally divided & no fourth part claimed is to the han-  
g of each of the Residuary Legatees as may call for their division  
from the said remainder shall be equally divided together with  
the increase thereof and equal proportion thereof claimed to the  
said Residuary Legatee or Legatees provided always that within  
twelve months shall settle and of the said Residuary Legatees  
to any part of the increase of the common Stock or Residue  
my estate bequeathed to them unless they contribute to  
keep up and increase thereof —

And lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my beloved sons  
William Bigham & John Bigham to be my whole and sole  
executors of this my last will & Testament, directed this

all former Wills, Gifts & Bequests by me made or done  
Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last Will &  
Testament. As Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my  
hands & signed my seal the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1815  
Signed Sealed published, pronounced & declared by  
the said Andrew Bigham as his last Will & Testament  
in the presence of us, who in his presence have  
sworn each other have known to subscribe as above.

In the Name of God our Lord. The 8<sup>th</sup> day of July 1768 I do declare  
of the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 1768 which Buffalo Creek in the County of Orange  
in the Province of North Carolina to Taylor by Trade being now  
with Health in bodily heat of perfect mind & memory, I do make  
as given unto God therefore, and calling to mind therefore the  
Mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all men  
once to die. Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament  
and as touching such worldly goods or estate where it may  
be... I do so far as I can with in this life... give direction  
dispossession of the same in the following manner & form —  
It is my will & I do order that in the first place that all my  
living Children shall have Equal part except the Little  
Child shall have some more.

And as also I do will & ordain my friend George Bassett  
to be my Executor in breeding of this my last will & Testament  
for my living wife & children according as the same  
directs, as also I do utterly disallow, revoke & annul  
all & every other former will or testament, Legacies,  
Executors, by me heretofore this time named will be null &  
unexecuted, Ratifying this & no other to be my last will &  
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 4<sup>th</sup>  
day of the year above written — Signed Sealed Published
