 County Province of N Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound
 memory bless'd be God; Do this 20th day of October in the year of our
 Lords 1775 make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner
 & form following that is to say after all my just debts & several
 charges are paid out of my Estate -

First I leave & bequeath to my loving wife Margaret Bowman with the plant
 Snow line and outlett my son Andrew is of age at which time my
 son Andrew is to enjoy the one half of said place untill his mothers
 decease or Marriage the first of which happens my son Andrew
 when he comes of age is to be sole owner & proprietor of said
 place like mine I give unto my wife for her & all the furniture
 belonging to it, her saddle & bridle; Likewise I give unto my
 Daughter Sarah Bowman Twenty five pounds in money to be paid to her
 as soon as it can conveniently be raised & Levied out of my Estate
 as also a feather bed & furniture her spinning wheel, a young sow
 milk & a saddle & bridle after the above divisions I give & bequeath
 unto my loving wife Margaret Bowman the third part of all
 my Estate real & personal as her right & property & like wares such
 furniture as is needful for house keeping is to be appraised & not sold
 such reserve is to be at the discretion of my loving wife, & the remain-
 ing part of my Estate real & personal is to be sold & equally divided
 amongst my three youngest Daughters Viz Rachel Bowman
 Margret Bowman and Abigail Bowman Vif any of my Children
 die before they come of age I desire & allow their part to be equally
 divided amongst all the others, but in case any of them die they
 their mother it shall be in my power to take all their part except
 five shillings & divide it equally amongst all the others -
 And I desire & appoint my wife Margaret Bowman Captain
 John Davidson & Joseph Moore sole Executors of this my last
 will & Testament In Witness whereof I the said Andrew
 Bowman have signed sealed & subscribed this my last will &
 Testament the 20th day of October 1775

Upon following, that is to say after all my just debts & several
charges are paid out of my Estate.

First I have & bequeath to my loving wife Margaret Bowman with the plant
I now live upon suitable my son Andrew is of age at which time my
son Andrew is to enjoy the one half of said Estate until his mother's
decease or Marriage the first of which happens my son Andrew
when he is twenty five years of age is to be sole Executor & Proprietor of said
Estate like unto I give unto my wife Margaret & all the household
belonging to it, her to wear & her saddle & bridle, Linnen & give unto my
Daughter Sarah Bowman Twenty five pounds in money to be paid to her
as soon as it can lawfully be raised & Levied out of my Estate
as also a feather bed & Furniture her spinning wheel, a young Saddle
more & a saddle & bridle after the above divisions I give & bequeath
unto my loving wife Margaret Bowman the third part of all
my Estate real & personal as her right & property & like unto such
Furniture as is needful for house keeping is to be appraised & not sold
such reserve is to be at the discretion of my loving wife, & the remain-
ing part of my Estate real & personal is to be sold & equally divided
amongst my three youngest Daughters Viz Rachel Bowman
Margaret Bowman and Abigail Bowman & if any of my Children
die before they come of age I desire & allow their part to be equally
divided between all the others, but in case any of them die they
their mother it shall be in her power to take all their part except
five shillings & divide it equally amongst all the children
And I desire & appoint my wife Margaret Bowman Captain
John Davidson & Joseph Moore sole Executors of this my last
will & Testament the Witnesses whereof the said Andrew
Bowman have signed, sealed & subscribed this my last will &
Testament the day & year above written -
