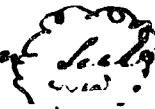


" I do hereby constitute make & ordain Richard Barry & Robert Men-

In the name of God Amen. I, Andrew Dunn of the County of Antrim
& State of New York, being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind
& memory thank be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality
of my body & knowing that it is appointed unto all men once
to die; Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament, that
is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul
unto God that gave it. My body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in a decent Christian burial at the direction of my friends
nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God; And as
touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless
me in this life; I give Devise & dispose of the same in the following
manner & form - First I give & bequeath to my eldest brother Robert
Dunn for the love good & affection I have to him one Negro fellow
named Zena together with one half of the money which is now in
the hands of Mr. Satter for the land which he owes me. Also the one
half of my household furniture, together with the half of my house
& estate excepting the reader named Legacies. Also I give & be-
queath unto my well beloved brother James Dunn the pla-
tation or piece of Land lying on the Creek & both the half
the other half of the said money lying in the hands of Mr. Satter.

the half of the Stock & household furniture with half of the farming tools
all this except the under named legacies: I also give unto my
sister Betty Jamison ten Shillings: I also give my brother John
Dunn ten Shillings, I likewise give & bequeath to Abby Thompson
ten Shillings: I likewise I give & bequeath unto Isabella & Newton
Shillings: I also give & bequeath to my sister Peggy Kincaid ten
Shillings, I give unto Eli Reed which was lawfully sworn to
my by his Mother & Father And ten Shillings.

disallow revoke & disannul and annul, & every other former Testament
by me in any wise before named, Making & confirming the

my body in a decent Christian manner: 2^d I follow as my just debts
to be paid: 3^d I give to my son Thomas Douglas Ten Shillings
4th I give to my daughter Margaret & Lanson my Sliding Chair & one half
of my household & kitchen furniture worth one hundred & eighty Dollars
5th I give to my daughter Jennet & Luan my mare & the other half of my
household & kitchen furniture: 6th I give to my grand daughter Peggy Douglas
one half of my son George Douglas one cow & half third he has now in his
possession: 7th I give to my son Joseph Douglas the rest of my Cattle also
I allow my son Joseph to sell my two negroes Peter & Mitty at a fair price
