I Andrew H. Kelly of the County of Mecklenburg & State of North Carolina
 being of sound mind & memory thank be to God for the same & call
 to mind the Mortality of my body I knowing that it is appointed for
 all men once to die Do make & ordain this my last will & testament
 I principally & first of all Bequeath unto my Soul into the hands of
 God who gave it my body to be buried in a Christian like
 & decent manner Nothing desiring but I shall remain there
 same again by the Mighty power of God. But as touching
 such worldly estate which with others placed God to keep
 me in this life I give & dispose of the same in the manner
 following that is to say I give & bequeath to my beloved wife
Rachel the one half of my personal estate & an Hundersell
 & comfortable Maintenance of the land & good house on & in
 the house I now live in as formerly enjoyed and all the
 profits arising from my lands during her natural life
 It is my will that all my personal property be realized at
 my death by three honest men chosen by my executors &
 having my desires on the above of my property to the sum
 of one full share at the appraisement It is my will that
 my Negroes Allen & his wife Rachel & Pig be kept for
 the support of my husband wife during her natural life & after
 my husband wife decease. It is my will that my old negro
 woman Rose for meritorious service be set free and if she
 is not able to maintain herself it is my will that my execu-
 tors out of my estate what is sufficient for her maintenance
 It is my will that my other three Negroes Allen, Rachel her
 wife & Pig be hired out at a reasonable price for two years
 to humane masters as high together as can be got not per-
 ceiving Allen & his wife unless it is their own choice & after
 two full years service for meritorious service it is my will
 that each of them Allen & his wife & Pig be set free provided
 the civil laws of our land will admit of it, last of these
 persons cannot be clothed. It is my will that they be
 sold at a Mecklenburg Co. NC M^o 1782d 1844 to humane

To mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testam.
I principally & first of all recommend my soul into the hand of
God who gave it, my body to be buried in a Christian like
& decent manner nothing doubting but I shall receive the

such world by estate wherewithal I have placed God to bless
me in this life. I give & dispose of the same in the manner
following that is to say: I give & bequeath to my beloved wife
Mackel the one half of my personal estate & an hundred
A comfortable Maintenance off the land I now live on & in
the house there live in as formerly enjoyed and all the
profits arising from my land during her natural life.
It is my will that all my personal property be apportioned
my chesare by three honest men chosen by my husband &
leaving my beloved wife her share of my property to the sum
of his full share at the apprasement. It is my will that
my negro slaves Allen & his wife Mackel & Pig be kept for
the support of my husband & wife during her natural life & after
my beloved wife decease. It is my will that my old negro
woman Rose for meritorious service be set free and if she
is not able to maintain herself it is my will that my husband
take out of my estate what is sufficient for her maintenance.
It is my will that my other three negroes Allen, Mackel his
wife & Pig be hired out at a reasonable price for his going
to Human Master as high together as can be got not pertur-
ing Allen & his wife unless it is their own choice, & after
two full years service for meritorious service it is my will
that each of them Allen & his wife & Pig be set free provided
the civil laws of our land will admit of it, but if these
persons cannot be discharged. It is my will that they be
sold at a moderate price at private sale to someone
Master leaving them to choose their own master
they can get them if not I allow my executors to do
for them remunerating not to part Allen & his wife
but if my beloved wife should appear the emancipation.

of the service of my negroes it is my will that the part of them be
sold off after my decease by my Executors & the balance be disposed
of according to my will. It is my will that all my personal
property that is not by my will'd. & as a legacy after my
decease be put to publick sale to the highest bidder except
my Negroes which if sold I allow to be disposed off at private
sale in the manner above mentioned, but after my beloved
wife deceased It is my will that all my lands & improvements
be put to publick sale by my Executors and I do hereby authori-
ze my Executors to make sufficient Deed or Deeds for said lands
and to bear and said lands against all claims from all
men and after the money is collected except of what ever as
it goes I give & bequeath to my sister in law Jane Robertson wife to my
first wife Forty Dollars — I give & bequeath to my nephew
James A. Bradley Twenty Dollars — I give & bequeath to my
Niece Jenny Bradley Twenty Dollars — I give & bequeath to
Robert Anderson a black son to my nephew John A. McVay
my Sister's wife — I give & bequeath to Robert McVay son
of my Brother John McVay Twenty Dollars — I give & bequeath
to my nephews John A. McVay, Jacob A. McVay, Joel A. McVay
McVay together with my Nieces Jenny Bradley, Eliza, Louisa
& Daggie McVay all my Library of books except such as my
beloved wife wishes to have to be equally divided among them
I give & bequeath my body clothes to my nephews John A.
McVay, James A. McVay, & my nephews Jacob & Joel McVay
living in east Tennessee, some silk Handkerchiefs to Jenny Bradley
I give & bequeath one hundred Dollars to the American Board
of Commissioners for Foreign Missions for the purpose of sending
the Gospel to the Heathen nations — I give & bequeath to
the American Bible Society, for the purpose of sending Bibles to
the poor & destitute Fifty Dollars — I give & bequeath to the Ameri-
can Education Society Fifty dollars, the purpose of building
new Pious Young Men for the State of Mecklenburg who is unable
to help themselves.

living in east Tennessee, some silk Handkerchiefs to Jenny Bradley
I give & bequeath one hundred Dollars to the American Board
of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, for the purpose of sending
the Gospel to the Heathen nations — I give & bequeath to
the American Bible Society, for the purpose of sending Bibles to
the poor & destitute Fifty Dollars — I give & bequeath to the Ameri-
can Education Society Fifty dollars, for the purpose of qualifying
young men for the gospel ministry who are unable
to help themselves — I give & bequeath Fifty Dollars for the
purpose of purchasing a Library of good books on Divinity
chosen by my executors to be situated at the Am^d Robert & H
Chambers for the benefit of his church & Neck Creek congregation

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Named them, as far as my memory goes, and if after all my just debts be paid, there should be still more money from my estate. It is my will it should all be put to some charitable purpose, such as schooling poor baptist children or poor widows that may such as my executors may think a charity & including or Cloathing the poor & destitute in the bounds where they have any perfect knowledge or in appropriating some to the Concord Bible Society or the Mecklenburg Education Society if they see in operation & practicability, or in sending some to some of the Missionary stations among the Indians in our country, or to the American Colonization Society to assist in sending the poor negroes to a state of freedom or any other way that my executors may think most for the Glory of God and the prosperity of Zion.

And I do hereby constatale & affirme my friends
friends Revd. Robert H. Brown & James Bradley &
my Neather John G. McGehee Executore of this my last
will & Testament and I do utterly renke all other
prior wills legacies & bequests by me before this time
named. Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my
last will & Testament In witness whereof I have here
set my hand & seal the day of year above written
