In the Name of God Amen. This 30th day of January
in the Year of our Lord 1779 I Andrew Hinson of New
Providence in the County of ~~Northampton~~ Ypsom, being
very sick & weak in body, but of perfect mind & memory
Thanks be given unto God. Therefore calling to mind
the vanity of my body & knowing that it is ap-
-pointed for all men once to die. Do make & ordain
this my last Will & Testament. That is to say primer-
-lyly & first of all I give & recommend my Soul into
the hands of Almighty God who gave it, & my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Chris-
-tian like & decent manner at the discretion of
my Executors nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty Power of God, And as touching such
worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to
bless me in this life, I give devise & dispose of the same
in the manner & form following, (That is to say)
First I Will that all those debts & duties which I owe in
right or conscience to any manner of person or persons
whosoever shall be well & truly certified & paid or ordained
to be paid within convenient time after my decease by
my Executors hereafter named. Item I give & bequeath
unto my beloved daughter Charizat Hinson a clock
bony horse named Diamond & a black & white Heifer
with calf named Beetly & the best bed & its furniture
& one half of the pewee, but which he is to make up
Thirty pounds to be by her or her Heirs given to my
youngest son Alexander Hinson when he is twenty
one years of age, & to bring him up & give him a good
Education as he opportunities will admit—
Item I also bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Sarah Hinson a young horse named Duke & a brown
Heifer named Bronny & a bed & its furniture and the
remaining half of the pewee, also two other heifers
the one black & the other Red with a white face
out of which she or his Heirs is or are to make

up thirty pounds to be by her or those given to my beloved
 Daughters Mary at the age of Eighteen years & to bring her up
 & give her as good education as her opportunities will allow
 them I also bequeath unto my beloved Daughters Elizabeth & Mary
Stinson two Cows, two Sheep & a Walnut Chest.
 Item I also give & bequeath unto my beloved Son David
Stinson all that Messuage Tenement or Tract of Land which
 now possesseth a black boy whose name is Jolly, part of which
 he or his heirs are to pay unto my beloved Son John Stinson
 the sum of fifty pounds of Carolina Currency when he bring
 at the age of Twenty one years & in case of Johns decease
 before he is of age his part when due is to be paid unto
 my youngest Son Alexander Stinson Also there is a Wife
 which I bequeath to John. Item I also bequeath unto
 my beloved Son Andrew Stinson a bay mare named Swift
 & a Sheep. Likewise I do make constitute Ordains &
 appoint Alexander Stewart, John Neely & John Wylie to be
 the only & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament &
 I do hereby & hereby disallow revoke & disannul all &
 every other former Testaments, Wills & Legacies bequeathed &
 executed by me in any time before this time, named
 willed & bequeathed, Dismissing & confirming this & no
 other to be my last will & Testament. In Witnes whereof

 written signed, sealed, published, pronounced & declared by
 the said Andrew Stinson as his last will & Testament in
