



" In the Name of God amen I James Bell Morrison having been supported by a kind & merciful God for near 78 years & even now enjoying a competent degree of health, & being with a sound mind & memory present to God for all his rich blessings freely given unto me, & still believing that I must soon die leave as these earthly enjoyments & blessings, do therefore make this as my last will & testament viz I give myself to that Almighty God who gave it to me, & my body I commit to the earth. Dust to dust not doubting but they will be received at the general judgment of God by his almighty power And as touching such small worldly portion of the good things of this life as God saw fit to bestow on me, I will give & bequeath as follows.

1. Prizes I will give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Louisa Bell to have her Heirs & assigns, even all the good & household furniture which I brought from my own house & is now here with said Louisa & her next one Mare & Silver Tea Spoons Item I will give said six Silver Tea Spoons to Penabella Morrison Daughter to son James deceased, Likewise I will & give to each of my 12 grand children one pocket Bible viz to Hannah, James, Neil, William Johnston, Nancy, Polly, Henry Dennis & Sarah Ann Morrison & 8 children of William Morrison deceased & to Louisa Morrison daughter to Alexander Morrison deceased, & to Richard, Penabella & to Peggy Morrison is 8 children of my son James Morrison deceased which will be my executors shall deliver to them at such times as my executors may judge prudent & before at the least to all such of them as I may not give before to myself between this time & my death, as God & y^r grace shall me then I will give & bequeath to my three beloved daughters, Jane Johnston & Louisa Bell to them their Heirs & assigns forever all the residue & remainder of my Estate, which estate includes two & my 1/2 negro Slave now to be divided among them share & share alike. But concerning my said 1/2 with just & equal care my will is that she shall not be sold like a brute beast but shall be kept by my said three daughters in case any circumstances to the contrary

of Slavery will admit of - by having & keeping her open about
 or six or those months such at a time as they may said daughters
 may agree on, for their wants of it each & successive, & that they
 may send these daughters to reside my dwelling appear as
 they please - And I, thy Shirley Morrison, & appoint my trusty
 & faithful sons in law Thomas Alexander & John Pitt to be my sole
 & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking
 all former & other wills either by word or writing, Ratifying
 & confirming they & no other to be in my last Will & Testament
 the witness whereof the said Elizabeth Morrison, have hereunto
 set my hand & seal this 15th day of March anno Domini 1808
 signed sealed & acknowledged by the said Elizabeth Morrison
 in her last Will & Testament in the presence of us

33 In the name of God amen. I Hugh Main of S^t Carolina
 & H. Marlboro^{ne} County (plantation) calling to mind my Mortality
 & that it is appointed for all men once to die considering
 it to be my duty to settle my affairs touching worldly things
 I would do it in the following manner, first that all my
 just Debts & funeral charges be paid, I give to my beloved
 wife Jane my Negro woman named Pink during her natural
 life or widowhood the said negro not to be taken away & if she
 and lives her mistress she is to have the privilege to choose her
 Master, during the foreaid time my wife to have her living on
 my plantation one bed & clothes such as she shall choose with
 all the bedding belonging to her, I give her my said house & all the
 trees lands such as she shall choose, two sheep all my household
 furniture of every kind, Horses, cows, sheep, Hogs plantation
 tools Wagon & all to be sold, the money to be divided between
 my wife, seven Sons & one daughter, difference being had to
 the value of the negro's that fall to me & another eight the
 value will appear in the bills of sale given to them the 6th
 day of August 1805 by me, I Hugh Main, plantation
 to be divided between my two sons George and
