bequeath my Cask & all my ~~movable~~ estate to Jacob Ramsom
& David Ramsom to be equally divided between them first
paying each of my sisters Solly bonds proclamation money.
And I do constitute make & ordain Jacob Ramsom and
David Ramsom sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament. And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and
disallow all & every other former Testaments Wills Legacies
bequests & Executions Notifying & confirming this and others
to be my last will & Testament. In witness hereof I have here-
unto set my hand & seal this 16th day of February in the year of
our Lord 1766. Signed Sealed Published pronounced & declared by
the said John Ramsom as his last will & Testament in the
presence of us who in his presence & in the presence of each
other have hereunto Subscribed our names

The non execution will of Anthony
Rafel De? Leant my brother Anthony Rafel in his last
wills being excited several times to make his will but his
dilect was such that it was not suitable to writing his
wills & direction to me was as near as I can remember.
Do you give John Finley £20 or £25 or a horse & saddle with
that sum, do you sell my lands & give David George & others
John Jean & Elizabeth there of it John to have as much as
both the girls give Betty Rafel £5 for mourning & said to be
his second last will. & in his first last will divide equally
my appurtenances between George & yourself, your children & the
said indeed land & give your own wife Ann £20. as to
mentioned some estate above him & up. as being in mind
of George's house if my son's child is he said I might give

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them help as much as the other children but do in that matter as
I thought best he mentioned Robert Harris Esquire to assist me
to act as Executors soon after he died on December 2nd 1789 -
The above is the substance of all I can recollect. Given under my
hand this 11th December 1789

Mecklenburg County N. Carolina Feb^y 16th 1785
I Alexander Robison of the County of Mecklenburg in the State of
N. Carolina weak in body but blessed be God in the regular use of
reason, make this my last Will & Testament, I commit my body
to the dust & my soul to God the great Creator humbly hoping
for pardon & acceptance through Christ the Saviour of sinners
I do hereby constitute & appoint my two brothers Matthew Robi-
son & David Robison Executors of this my will. My will is that my
plantation principally lying on the N. side of Paw Creek in this
County joining the lands of George Cathey, John Beatty &c be sold
by my Executors & the money arising from the sale be distribut-
ed by them in the following manner Fifty pounds to my
Father & Mother. Twenty five pounds to my Sister Mary -
Ten pounds to Mary the daughter of Matthew Robison her husband
to Mary the daughter of Andrew Larmor - Ten pounds to Mary
the daughter of Isaac Flavia - Five pounds to Sarah the daughter
of John Swin - Ten pounds to my sister Sarah Peterson
Also my will is that all my debts be paid out of the Re-
mainder And should there be any money arising from the sale
of the land still remaining, my will is that it be divided
equally between my three brothers Matthew David & Isaac
Robison - Also I give & bequeath my black men to my Father
Richard Robison - Also I give & bequeath my gray horse to my
Sister Mary Robison - Also I give & bequeath my bay horse to
my brother Matthew Robison - Also my will is that my
sundry man be sold & her price equally divided between my
three brothers David & Richard Robison. This is my last Will
to be my last Will & Testament & I have hereunto set my hand
at Mecklenburg as a testimony of the same on the 11th day of December 1789
