I bequeath unto my dear & loving Brother Sam^l Hall
all I am possessed of to them & in case of their being removed by death
into the Eternal world I then allow it to be given away by agree-
ment to the nearest in blood as the Law directs—

I do hereby constitute my dear & truly friend Thomas M^{rs}
to be my only Executor of this my last will & Testament, & he then
bequeath do make all other Wills & Testament who have
Acknowledging this as my last will as such sign it with my
hand & seal it with my Seal & Acknowledged this 16th day
of September in the Year 1782.

In the name of God Amen. This 21st day of November 1798
I, Archibald Henderson of the State of Carolina a freeholder
County, being in perfect mind & memory thanks be given to
God, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die; Do
hereby make this my last will & Testament, That as to my personal
& first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of the
God who gave it, & my body to his wise providence & to some
such lawfully Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to bless
this life & give choice & dispose of the same in the following
manner & form— In witness I give & bequeath to James my
son my Plantation to which I live on together with my wife
Wife & his & furniture—

I give to my beloved Daughter Rebecca three hundred pounds lawful
money of this State together with a mare called Rebecca a saddle & bridle
with her mother's Chest & all her mother's clothes & all her mother's furniture
I further will bequeath the Trust of my said Children until they come of
age to my Brother & Sister James & Margaret Henderson & them, to live on
my plantation to have & hold occupy & enjoy the same together with the
the Hacks & Hoes until my said Children arrive at mature age. I
further will that if my Brother & Sister make any Alienation in their
living & move off the plantation, I will my Executors herein after
mentioned to rent the place & convert the rents to the two children
I further will & bequeath the two Cows to be kept for the use of the
Children with the increase of the mares & two Cows to abide in the
hands of said Brother & Sister, all for the Children's use, I further will
that if any one of said Children die before the said age the
surviving one is Heir. I further will that all my other Effects be sold
and I further will & bequeath to my loving sister Margaret Henderson
the sum of Eighty pounds, I further will & bequeath to my loving
Brother James Henderson a bay mare called Bonny. I like it that if my
Daughter Rebecca three hundred pounds be not in full it is to be paid
in full by her Heir. I likewise constitute make & ordain Brother
William Henderson, Benjamin Wilson & James Henderson Executors of
my last will & Testament the Witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal the day & year above Written —
