3. In the name of God amen. I Arthur Jamison although in a
failing state of body yet blessed be God in a sound & tranquil state of
mind do make this my last will & Testament as follows - 1st
I give unto my loving wife Mary Jamison my Negro woman
Jan. to be at her disposal also, also her child George until it comes
to the age of twenty one years. Then I will that that child go out
free. I also wish the Board of the County of Chechenberg to
mention specially this part of my will. Now & at all future times
I further give & bequeath to my wife a choice of my horses, three
Cows & six Sheep her choice. Also her Saddle Bed & furniture
with all her apparel then living on the plantation I now live on
during her widowhood or natural life. Allowing her the
necessaries convenient of buildings as she now enjoys -
2^d I give unto my son Robert Jamison a negro boy Jack which
is now in his possession. - 3rd I give & bequeath unto my son
William Jamison a negro boy George which he has now
in his possession - 4th I give & bequeath unto my son Arthur
Jamison a negro boy Martin, also the plantation I now
live on subject to the above incumbrance -
5th I also allow my wife to have the privilege of keeping
& disposing of all the year on cloth for the benefit of the

family as if it was still with her, & also the Hogs that may be
left for the support of the family, — 6th I also will that the
remainder of my property not intended be sent to sale as soon
as may be after this Coⁿ be made, ~~and after my just debts~~
and garnished which as now agreed on to be made, & after my
just debts are paid to be equally divided among all my
Heirs, my wife, Son & daughters the others falling to my
daughter Anna Elliott to be reserved in the hands of my
Heirs & to be given for the support of her & children & to
help to school the Children — 7th I also do appoint
David McDonald to be the sole Executor of this my last
will & Testament which I now publish & declare to be so.
Provoke all other wills heretofore by me made this 18th
day of March 1817.
