22 In the name of God amen. I Arthur Jamison although in a
frail state of body yet blessed be God in a sound & tranquil state of
mind Do make this my last Will & Testament as follows viz —
1st I bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Jamison my Negro woman
Jan, to be at her disposal & care, also her child George until it arrive
at the age of twenty one years. Then I will that, that child go out
free. I also with the consent of the County of Mechlenburg to
sanction & ratify this part of my Will, now & at all future times
I further give & bequeath to my wife a choice of my horses, three
cows & six sheep her choice. Also her saddle bed & furniture
with all her apparel then living on the plantation I now live on
during her widowhood or natural life. allowing her the
necessary conveniences of buildings as she now enjoys —
2^d I give unto my son Robert Jamison a negro boy Jack who
is now in his possession — 3^d I give & bequeath unto my son
William Jamison a negro boy George which he has now
in his possession — 4th I give & bequeath unto my son Arthur
Jamison a negro boy Martin, also the plantation I now
live on subject to the above incumbrance —
5th I also allow my wife to have the privilege of keeping
& disposing of all the yarn or cloth for the benefit of the

family as if it was still with me, & also the Hogs that may be
left for the support of the family, — 6th I also will that the
remainder of my property not will be put to sale as soon
as may be after the crop be made, ~~and after my just debts~~
and gathered which as was agreed on to be made. & after my
just debts are paid to be equally divided among all my
Wife, my wife, sons & daughters the share falling to my
daughter Jerry Elliott to be reserved in the hands of my
Parents & to be given for the support of her & children & to
help to school the children — 7th I also Ordain & appoint
David McDonald to be the Sole Executor of this my last
will & Testament which I now publish & declare to be so.
I revoke all other wills heretofore by me made this 18th
day of March 1817.

by God for it, in a sound state of mind & memory & in a sound
state of health of body, but calling to mind my mortality &
that it is appointed by an Eternal decree of Heaven for all
men once to die; Do make this my last will & Testament in
manner following that is to say, I will that my body be
decently interred or buried, — & 2^d that all my just debts be paid
out of what worldly estate with which God hath blessed me &
will the following distribution — I will & bequeath unto my
Wife Polly Jamison Thirty dollars — Next I will & bequeath
unto my daughter Rachel Jamison my horse with all his tack-
lings — Next I will & bequeath unto my Son Jerry Jamison
my Bedstead Chest, I also will & allow him ten dollars &
allowing the price of my mare & saddle with interest there-
on — & my Son Jerry is of full age, which property I
will to be put to sale immediately after my decease
I will & allow my wife Rachel Jamison Thirty dollars
