remains to be equally divided among my children & grand  
children there to be named, William M'Donald my son Thompson  
James M'Donald & my daughter Jane Robertson & my grand  
daughter Margaret Thompson - And I do recommend & desire my  
former Will & Testimony, and acknowledge this Form, to be  
this to be my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of  
our Lord 1770.

To be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my executors not departing but at the general expense and care of said friends & I shall require the same again by the mighty power of God to bless & comfort my earthly estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give also in possession of the same in the following manner & form - First I give & bequeath to Jane Creek my dear Sister, five Shillings, and to my Sister Deborah five Shillings of good & lawful money of North Carolina -

Secondly, I give to my beloved Brother John Martin whom I constituted make & declare my only & sole executor of this my last will & Testament, all & singular my mare saddle & Horseshoe & all my clothes & my crop of corn by him freely to be passed & enjoyed; And I do hereby utterly disallow & revoke & disannul all & every other former instrument, will, legacies, bequests & executors by me in any wise before this time named, written & bequeathed; Ratifying & approving this & no other to be my last will & testament.
